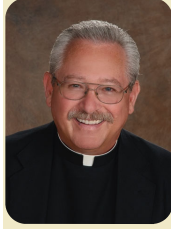

From the Pastor (Reprinted from Last Year)



Dear Parishioners,

I watched a movie last night entitled "The Letters". I highly recommend it. It is about the life of Mother Teresa of Calcutta. Movies like this are always inspiring to me and make me feel like I'm not doing enough to serve the Lord. Actually, I think we are probably all doing what we can and the difference is that we are just called to different things; for example, many, many parents are every bit as devoted as Mother Teresa was; it's just that we don't always see that as a calling from God... but it is!

She knew her calling from the age of twelve although it took her a while to finally get there. She started as a cloistered nun but knew that God wanted her to work with the poorest of the poor. After twelve to fifteen years, I think, as a cloistered nun she finally moved out of the cloister and served them directly. She had obstacles to overcome in accomplishing her goal, as we always do; I think that is the devil at work.

One of the themes that was emphasized in the movie was that she felt abandoned by God. Every time that came up I was struck with the connection between her feeling of abandonment and the feelings that the poor with whom she worked. They must have felt abandoned by society if not also abandoned by God. I thought how perfect it was for her to be helping them. What compassion she must have had because of their similar feelings.

I've heard others say that her life must have been a sham because she presented herself as a person of faith but now it comes out that she didn't feel God's presence. I think her continuing being a person of faith, in spite of her lack of feeling God's presence is a sign of how holy her life on earth was. In the midst of emptiness, she continued to be faithful and be the presence of God's love to so many. That shows tremendous strength if you ask me. It reminds me of the Hebrew Scripture portrayal of Israel's suffering and feeling that God had abandoned them.

This movie was about an extraordinary person... or maybe an ordinary person in extraordinary circumstances. Many of us deal with similar but very different things. Again, I think of parents. Parents may at times suffer greatly and feel that the deck is stacked against them. Yet they have to hang in there, being faithful to their commitments and responsibilities, to what God has called them to do. Parents oftentimes feel the pain of the suffering of their spouse and their children. They have to be there to comfort and support them so they can go on. They nurse them when they are sick or injured, they worry about them when they are away, they pray that God will be there for them.

Parents make the same kind of commitment and at times feel unappreciated and all alone in their work. Yet parents are faithful to those to whom they have committed. It is a holy work that they do. I wish we had saints who were canonized because of that. We need them as examples, too.

PARISH FINANCES

In order to fulfill our budget, we need to collect an average of \$12,722 in the collection basket each week. Some weeks may be higher and some lower but we need to maintain that average. Additionally, we have budgeted for an average of \$12,802 to be contributed monthly through our Online Giving contribution program.

The total amount budgeted through these sources is \$660,095 this year. Our budget includes another \$106,384 expected income from other sources; (Annual Catholic Appeal rebates, Christmas & Easter collections, Sacramental Donations, Interest, One-time gifts & bequests, etc.).

GOSPEL MEDITATION

ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

13th Sunday in Ordinary Time

"Whoever loses his life for my sake will find it." When Jesus says paradoxical things like this, we can still trust him. Even when he makes claims that, at first glance, seem impossible, we know that he's not talking gibberish. Why? Because Jesus lived the ultimate paradox: he brought life out of death. His resurrection proves for us that things are not always as they appear. The Crucifixion, which looked like the end of Jesus' influence, was actually a tremendous new beginning.

So when Jesus promises that we will find life through a kind of death, we shouldn't question his claim. Of course in today's Gospel, Jesus isn't necessarily talking about physical death, although the "red" martyrs who suffer for him do in fact find their reward in eternal life. "White" martyrdom, on the other hand, is a kind of death to self that doesn't involve bloodshed. It means putting love and generous service ahead of our own self-gratification. It means doing these things for the sake of Christ. When he tells us to love our neighbors as ourselves, this is what he's talking about.

So, how can we be white martyrs today? How can we sacrifice our desire for perfect comfort, or entertainment on demand, or status or pleasure or sleep or whatever else for the sake of serving another person? In our families, in our schools and workplaces, in our parishes, in our neighborhoods and our communities, there are myriad opportunities to "lose our lives" for the sake of Christ. But don't forget, in dying to ourselves, we will find our lives in a new way! The fulfillment Christ offers in return, both now and in eternity, will be far better than anything we try to cling to on our own.

LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

How does your commitment to Jesus Christ affect your life? Our faith is not just a private affair but something that influences all of our relationships. Our baptism brings us into a very intimate relationship with God and makes us a brother or a sister to all of God's children. That identity we share colors how we relate to them and the level of responsibility we have to them. If we open ourselves to truly receive our God as Father and those with whom we journey as brothers and sisters, it can profoundly change and affect us. How has your baptism changed you?

WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC TRADITIONS EXPLAINED

Question: What does Jesus mean when he talks about taking up our cross?

Answer: Our journey of faith begins in baptism. When we are faithful to it, we find God's plan for us, his way of allowing us to participate in his saving work, which in turn becomes for us our own salvation. Stated simply, we share in the mission of Jesus each day. We live our life with all of its ups, downs, joys, and sorrows in union with the mission of Jesus. Our work then is holy. It is joined to the cross, God's will for Jesus--the way in which he destroys sin and death and makes eternal life possible. His sacrifice accomplishes what we ourselves cannot do.

To take up the cross, then, means that we share in the mission of Jesus and so embrace the sufferings of the cross. It is our daily life made holy, given a redemptive mission. It is our purpose and goal to unite our life to that of Christ. St. Paul says it best, "If we have grown into union with him through a death like his, we shall also be united with him in the resurrection" (Rom 6:5).
