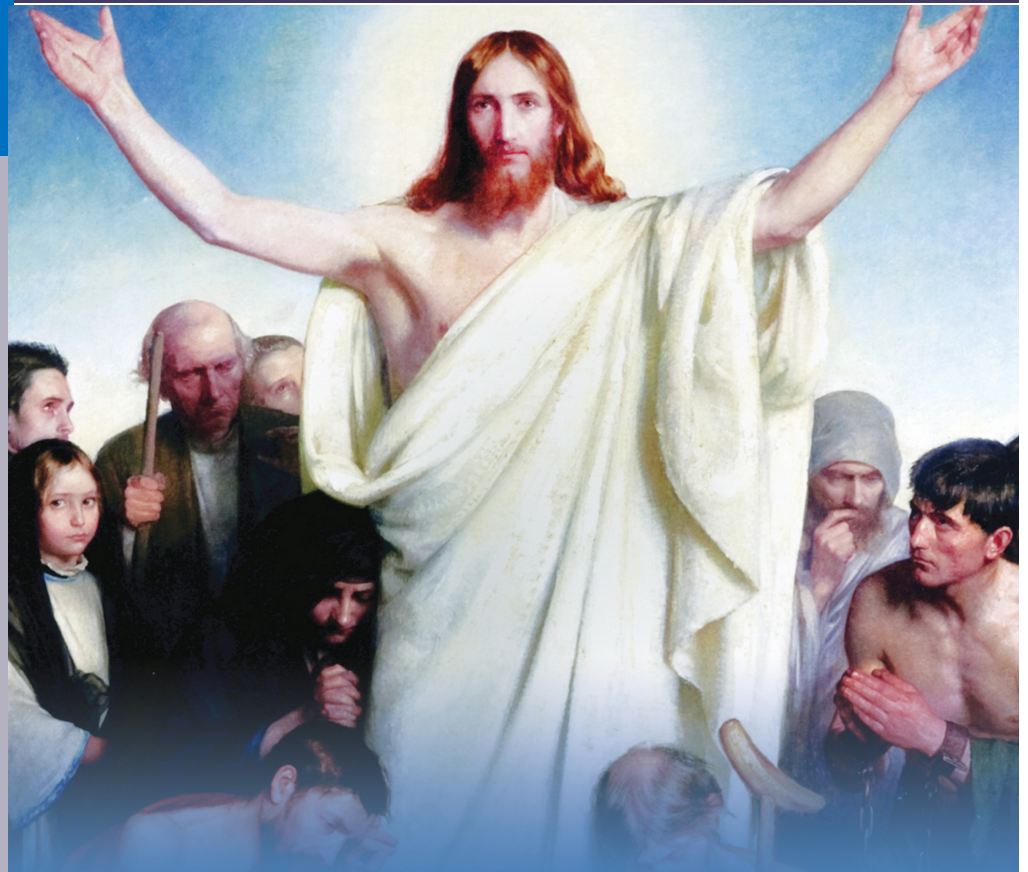

From the Pastor



This is a reprint from 2012. It's timely again because I've been reflecting on marriage. We celebrated a 50 Wedding anniversary on Saturday and I con-celebrated a funeral of a gentleman who had been married to his wife for 67 years. Both marriages are marriages of strong individuals who beautifully share(d) a communion of life and love that is marriage.

Dear Parishioners,

This last Saturday, I thought my homily was too "teachy" and long. I was surprised after Mass to find out that we finished in good time and doubly surprised to hear all the people who told me it was a wonderful homily, one of my best. The Sunday Masses had the same results. I had more positive comments about this homily than, I think, any other. But, not everyone experienced it as so great.

I'm told that they youth, or young adults, or maybe both, thought it was too preachy and didn't feel it addressed their lives. They're right; I was preaching to the older adults. I think it is our responsibility to make marriage desirable to our young people. Even though we have many good marriages in our parish which hold up the value of marriage, the statistics, nationally and among Catholics, don't look that good. Still I would hope that some of the things I said would have touched our young people as meaningful.

Secondly, because I was talking about what I think we should be teaching our young people, some parents began reflection on the fact that their children didn't turn out perfect and their feeling that they were, somehow, at fault. That's a common parental feeling but it implies that we have the power to make everything turn out right; we don't! Life doesn't give us that power. The grace of the Sacrament doesn't give us the power. When other lives are involved, God gives them the freedom to choose and He loves them whatever choice they make. I think, if they open themselves to His love, he will love them into goodness. We don't have the power but maybe we can be instruments of God's love.

I've spoken with several parents about raising children and shared my believe that our job is not to mold our children but to help them discover who they are, who God created them to be. Often times we can see personality traits in our children that we worry about, things that may cause problems for them later in life. I, personally, don't think that we should try to get them to suppress those personality traits; I think we should get them to understand them and find a way to live out of the good side of that trait.

For example, I have two very strong traits connected to the sins of gluttony and lust. Gluttony, of course, is concerned with the quantitative and lust the qualitative. I'm not using lust in the modern sense of sexual sin but in the classical sense of the desire for deeper, more intense, experiences. The traits that are expressed by gluttony and lust are destructive when expressed that way but they have good expressions too. The intensity with which I sometimes preach is connected to the same trait as lust is. I've noticed that people respond to my preaching more when I use that energy. That is a good use of the trait. If I had tried to get rid of the trait, I wouldn't be able to use it for that purpose; actually I don't think we can get rid of the traits anyway.

So... parenting is not the easiest job in the world. And... even if we do it perfectly, it doesn't necessarily result in our children being perfect. Still, we can thank God that we can be a source of His love for that difficult child. He probably made us the parent because nobody else could do it as well, even though we might think we did a poor job.

PARISH FINANCES

In order to fulfill our budget, we need to collect an average of \$12,722 in the collection basket each week. Some weeks may be higher and some lower but we need to maintain that average. Additionally, we have budgeted for an average of \$12,802 to be contributed monthly through our Online Giving contribution program.

The total amount budgeted through these sources is \$660,095 this year. Our budget includes another \$106,384 expected income from other sources; (Annual Catholic Appeal rebates, Christmas & Easter collections, Sacramental Donations, Interest, One-time gifts & bequests, etc.).

GOSPEL MEDITATION

ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

14th Sunday in Ordinary Time

"Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest." Is there anyone to whom this doesn't apply? Don't we all have to labor at something, whether it be work, school, relationships, household affairs, or personal, emotional, or mental battles? Aren't we all burdened in some way at some time?

Jesus offers us powerful words of consolation in today's Gospel. He promises us rest. He calls all of us to himself, along with the baggage and burdens that we carry, and assures us that we will find relief. Thank God! What a gift for our tired, weary souls.

The strange part about the passage, however, is when Jesus suggests that in order to find this wonderful rest, we have to take a "yoke" upon our shoulders. This of course is a reference to the animal harness of old that would join two oxen together to share the weight of the load they carried. He tells us, "Take my yoke upon you and learn from me... For my yoke is easy, and my burden light." Somehow, joining Jesus in his work is supposed to bring us rest! Contrary to the standard belief that NOT working is the source of relief, Jesus urges us to join him in his mission in order to find peace. But what is this mission? To be "meek and humble of heart." Jesus' work is to do whatever God the Father wants him to do. As he says elsewhere, "My food is to do the will of the one who sent me and to finish his work" (Jn 4:34). So, it seems that if we also humbly submit to doing God's work--with Jesus right alongside us as our partner in the task--we will "find rest" for ourselves. So as we labor through the trials of the day, may we bear this in mind, and pray that we may handle them according to the will of God.

LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

Jesus tells us, "Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest." These words may seem a bit contradictory at first given how hard it can often be to be a disciple and live as Jesus taught. While the Gospel can be difficult, it is never a burden. On another occasion Jesus says of his Father, "It is mercy I desire, not sacrifice." God desires our hearts and when we give him our hearts we become free. We become free of ourselves and discover the joy that comes from serving God and others. We can easily get very rigid in terms of our faith, think that we know better, and place expectations on others that can be more of a burden than a source of new life. Are we willing to be open and learn from Jesus?

WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC TRADITIONS EXPLAINED

Question: What is unique or different about the way Catholics read and are exposed to the Bible?

Answer: Catholics are exposed to Scripture primarily through the Sunday readings from a book known as the Lectionary. The Lectionary is a book of selected passages from the Bible set in the context of a liturgical season, such as Advent, Lent, or ordinary time. There are four readings assigned to any Sunday: the first reading (usually from the Old Testament), the responsorial psalm, the second reading (usually from a New Testament letter), and the Gospel reading.

These readings together give them a new context. The selected readings relate to one another in a unique manner that is not present in the Bible text itself. In close proximity to each other, these readings now have the opportunity to converse with each other in a way that would have not been possible before. A homilist pays attention to all four readings, preparing a reflection that speaks of this conversation among the readings, enabling us to zero in on what this unique combination of God's word has to say to us this particular Sunday.

Next time you attend Sunday liturgy, try reading the Scripture ahead of time and see how this new relationship among the readings addresses and challenges you to be a better Christian here and now.
