Gospel

Then Jesus took the loaves, gave thanks, and distributed them to those who were reclining, and also as much of the fish as they wanted. When they had had their fill, he said to his disciples, "Gather the fragments left over, so that nothing will be wasted." So they collected them, and filled twelve wicker baskets with fragments from the five barley loaves that had been more than they could eat.



From the Pastor

17th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Cycle B



Last Sunday we heard a selection from the Gospel of Mark wherein the disciples had just returned from the mission which Jesus had sent them. Jesus invited them to go with Him to a deserted place to rest and they got into a boat to go there. The people found out about it and hurried there on foot getting there before Jesus and the disciples. This short selection ends with "his heart was moved with pity for them, for they were like sheep without a shepherd; and he

began to teach them many things." Mark then relates the story of the Feeding of the Five Thousand

This Sunday, we switch to John's telling of the story of the feeding. It begins, for us, a five-week series of reflecting on "the meaning of the bread." John's and Mark's telling of the story are similar, but John includes the people's reaction to Jesus' miracle. In both, the disciples are thinking in worldly terms and can't fathom feeding the vast multitude. In John the people are thinking in worldly terms also and want to make Jesus their king.

Notice that this selection starts by telling us that a large crowd was following Jesus because they had seen the signs Jesus was performing on the sick. Now, they see the multiplication of the loaves. Why wouldn't they focus on worldly things; He could really improve their lives. But this type of improvement, evidently, is not what Jesus was offering. Our selection ends with Jesus slipping away because they want to make Him king.

Notice the interplay between the words that Jesus sees the crowd "coming to Him" and his question to Philip. Jesus sees their need to be nourished and invites Philip to reflect upon how they can take care of the people's need. Philip and the others can only think in worldly terms and don't see how they can do anything. The Gospel says that Jesus was testing Philip. Was Jesus speaking of the deeper need for nourishment which we all have?

What would Philip have had to answer to pass the test? I'm not sure I know, exactly, but I suppose he could have said something like "Lord, I don't know, but if I put my trust in you, I know something can be done." Maybe he could have said, "Lord, you're all the nourishment they really need." The Eucharistic connection in this story is obvious. It's about more than just physical nourishment.

It seems to me that, like the people of Jesus' time, we oftentimes think in worldly terms. We are thinking in worldly terms whenever we think a particular candidate, or particular political platform, or a particular set of rules will fix everything and bring us a better life. These things are all external to us. When they are provided, as many people have found out, our spiritual emptiness remains. It doesn't fill us, then, like Jesus' loaves which should have enough left over to fill twelve wicker baskets.

What is the real connection between the Eucharist and our day-to-day lives? How does the nourishment, which the Lord wants to give me spill over to feed those symbolized by the twelve wicker baskets? How can I open myself to allowing the Lord to nourish me in the manner He desires for me?

GOSPEL MEDITATION -ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

July 29, 2018 - 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Have you ever wanted to be part of something bigger? Even the most independent among us likes to make changes and have an impact on others. In this Sunday's Gospel reading, Jesus demonstrates one of his most iconic miracles - the multiplication of the loaves. It is a sign of the institution of the Eucharist, when we are fed not by bread but by the Body of Christ.

In the stories of ancient pagan gods, mighty deeds were done entirely under the gods' own power. Mortals may have offered sacrifices to start the chain of events, but they played little role in the miraculous works themselves. Jesus is entirely different. The multiplication of the loaves is a prime example not only of Jesus' power over nature, but of the way he equips his disciples.

First, Jesus asks Philip a question "to test him." Jesus has seen the crowds and "he himself knew what he was going to do," but he wants his disciples to start thinking about the problem and its solution. Andrew offers a suggestion, though he isn't confident in it. "There is a boy here who has five barley loaves and two fish; but what good are these for so many?" Jesus honors Andrew's suggestion, takes the offered loaves, and delegates the Apostles to bring order to the crowd. When the crowd has been fed, the Apostles "gather the fragments left over." In the process, they discover with wonder that bread has been produced in super abundance.

In the sacraments, God works through simple matter to make grace real in our lives. He works in and through us as well. Are you facing problems that could have spiritual solutions? Is there a need in your parish or community that you could meet? Whatever our hesitancies, Jesus honors our simple loaves and fishes. He invites us to participate in his generous work of redemption, just as we are.
