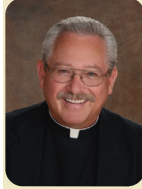

From the Pastor



Dear parishioners,

Last week I wrote about a news report that Anaheim had removed the benches from bus stops around Disneyland. I didn't note that Anaheim plans on replacing the benches with benches containing a center arm rest effectively making them useless as sleeping places.

There are other efforts to make places uncomfortable for homeless seeking a location to sleep. A Greenwich Village bookstore install sprinklers to come on a various times during the night to keep homeless people from sleeping in front of their store. In London, spikes have been placed in places where homeless have been known to sleep. These architectural elements are, evidently, called defensive architecture.

Defensive architecture? Wow! To me, it sounds like we are making an enemy out of the homeless. I think it is an attitude thing and I think our words belie our inner attitudes. More and more I discover negative attitudes toward the homeless. The problem I'm having with this is that the attitudes seem to be negative toward the homeless rather than being negative toward homelessness and it's causes.

On a visit to one project for the homeless I learned that they help those who are ready to accept help. They do good work; I don't deny that but I worry about those who are not ready to accept help. Do we just write them off? Does that mean their situation is their own fault? Additionally, this project seems to focus on bad choices made by the homeless as the sole cause of their homelessness. This places the blame on the person when we know that decisions we have made as a society have contributed to homelessness.

At a meeting of the East County Homeless Task Force I learned that we consider 50% of our homeless to have mental illness issues. They were referred to as the uncooperative mentally ill. What do we expect of people who are mentally ill? We put them on the street starting back in the 60's, let's live with it or do something about it but treat them with respect. Maybe if we hang in there with them, and treat them as equals, we'll discover that we can do relationship with them and work in the problem together.

I also learned that we are going to install signs warning people that if they give money to the homeless, they are part of the problem. I give to the homeless. I don't think that if I stop giving them money, the problem will be solved. I'm not going to let signs bully me into stopping. And, I think giving them money is a way of acting out Matthew 25. Also, I recommend looking the homeless in the eye; let them know that we see them as human beings, children of God, our brothers and sisters.

I also learned, at that meeting, that the Task Force is going to recommend defensive architecture ideas to business in East County. Ugh. The Task Force is doing many good things. I support that. All I ask is that we check our attitudes and make sure it is homelessness we are fighting and not the homeless.

Finally, I know that the tourism part of our economy might do better without the visible homeless. Real solutions will take some time. Meanwhile, wouldn't it be better if we were known for being compassionate toward our homeless rather than hostile to the less fortunate?

PARISH FINANCES

In order to fulfill our budget, we need to collect an average of \$12,722 in the collection basket each week. Some weeks may be higher and some lower but we need to maintain that average. Additionally, we have budgeted for an average of \$12,802 to be contributed monthly through our Online Giving contribution program.

The total amount budgeted through these sources is \$660,095 this year. Our budget includes another \$106,384 expected income from other sources; (Annual Catholic Appeal rebates, Christmas & Easter collections, Sacramental Donations, Interest, One-time gifts & bequests, etc.).

GOSPEL MEDITATION: 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time

"When he finds a pearl of great price, he goes and sells all that he has and buys it." Jesus today gives us the image of a merchant who knows he has discovered a great treasure. In fact, its value is so tremendous that the man is willing to sell EVERYTHING else in order to possess it. Why? Because he knows it will all be worth it. He knows that the pearl will bring him more reward than anything else he has ever owned, more even than all his possessions combined.

This Gospel story is meant to help us understand the unfathomable value of the kingdom of heaven. Nothing else can compare to it. No material item, no honor or success, can compete with this pearl of great price. Everything we have, short of this, is FINITE: limited, temporary, and ultimately fleeting. Eternal happiness, on the other hand, is INfinite. It never ends. This is the deep contentment, the satisfaction, the peace, and happiness that we crave, the kind that doesn't disappoint.

Like the merchant in the parable, we too should understand the value of this discovery. As Christians, we have "found" the treasure beyond all other treasures! Life in Christ, both now and in heaven, is truly the pearl of great price. The only question is whether we are willing to "sell" all that we have to obtain it. In other words, are we willing to release the other things that claim hold on us? Are we ready to put Christ first in our lives? All of us need to take pause from time to time and examine our attachments and priorities. Money, pleasure, success, or comfort can often seem so important to us that we falsely begin to imagine these things will bring the happiness we so desire. But the message is loud and clear today: the kingdom of heaven is the true treasure we long for.

LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

As human beings, we desire to find happiness. This desire is so strong that we often go to great lengths to discover and obtain it. Unfortunately, our search sometimes brings us to the wrong places. We mistakenly think that money, certain possessions, social status, popularity, and even power and control can satisfy the longing that exists in our hearts. Time and again, one after another, these things come up empty and we find ourselves with the same unfulfilled longing gnawing at us deep within. It is only the kingdom of God that can satisfy our desire and that ache. We are made and hardwired for this. When we discover it, we know that we have found something very special--a pearl of great price. Then, everything comes together and is put in proper order: our relationship with God, others, ourselves, and even the universe in which we live.

WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC TRADITIONS EXPLAINED

Question: Why do we have a liturgical season called ordinary time? Can you explain?

Answer: Ordinary time is the longest season of the liturgical year. It begins the Monday after January 6, the Epiphany, and goes until the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent. That period can last anywhere from five to eight weeks, depending on when Easter is celebrated. Ordinary time picks up again the Monday after Pentecost Sunday and lasts from twenty-three to twenty-seven weeks, until the end of the liturgical year, the Saturday before Advent begins.

Why the name ordinary? "Ordinary" is not in contrast to "extraordinary" or "special" but rather stresses the Latin language notion of "ordinal" or numbered Sundays. The Latin title for the season, "tempus ordinarium," conveys the sense that this time of the year is measured or numbered time. Measured time can allude simply to the numbered Sundays, or the notion that these Sundays are a "measured" time to deepen and immerse ourselves completely in the realities of Jesus' incarnation, ministry, passion, death, and resurrection. Ordinary time offers us the opportunity to connect the ordinary lived experiences of our lives with those of Jesus, who modeled for us how to live a truly human existence.

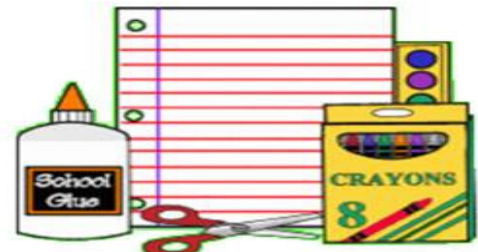
**2 Poverty Level Schools

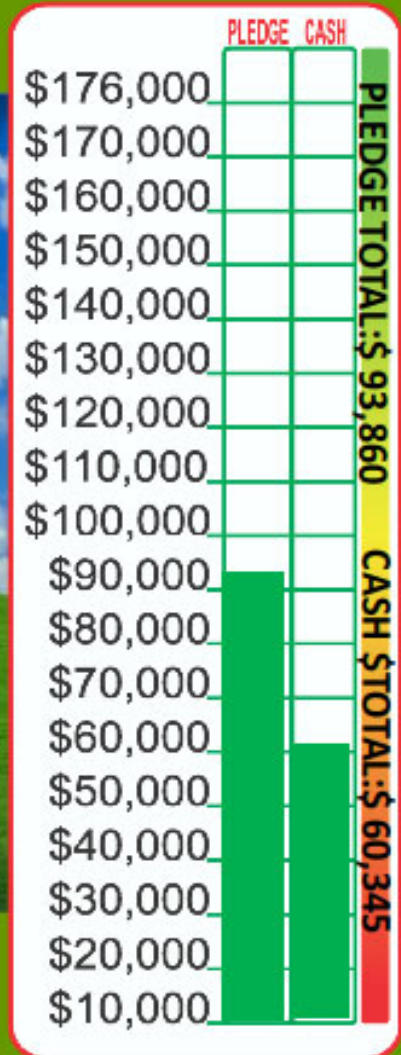

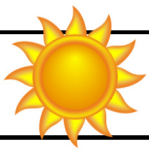
