First Reading : Daniel 7:9-10, 13-14

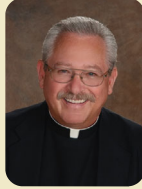
Second Reading: 2 Peter 1:16-19

From the Pastor



Dear parishioners,

Last week I wrote about attitudes toward the homeless. My goal was to help us maintain an attitude of Christian love and respect toward are brothers and sisters who are homeless.

After one of the Masses, someone came up to me and told me that the homeless don't want help and that they are happy were they are. Honestly, I don't remember whether he said that "some of the homeless don't want help" or simply "the homeless don't want help". Either way, I didn't handle it very well.

Of course there are homeless who just want to be left alone. In fact, there is a documentary called "Lost Angels: Skid Row is My Home". One of its messages is that some people on skid row want to live there, on the street. One person explained how he was happy that the city got rid of the druggies and alcoholics who were always causing trouble so they could live there in peace. I can't imagine what his reasoning was for wanting to live on the street but I know that it is better to try to understand him than to try to judge him.

I know that many homeless will refuse the offer to sleep in a shelter. Dormitory style shelters are a problem for them. They get their shoes stolen and have to deal with bedbugs and the like. They say the street isn't perfect but the problems you know are better than the problems you don't know.

Another objection to my column was the feeling that I was saying that everyone should give money to the homeless. Maybe the way I said that giving money to them was "a way of acting out Matthew 25" made them feel that way. I apologize to anyone who felt that way but it was certainly not what I meant. There are other ways of acting out Matthew 25, too. The important thing is that we all do something to act out the Gospel.

An experience I had today made me reflect on the fact that I said we should "look the homeless in the eye and let them know that we see them as human beings." As the people are coming in to eat at Desayunador, in Tijuana, I oftentimes stand where I can greet them when they come in. Today, a lady closer to the door refused to shake the hand of one of them. They don't all shake hands but some, especially once they get to know you, want to recognize you as a friend. When the gentleman who was refused got to me, I extended my hand as I said "Buenos dias" and he said "no" in a quiet sort of way. I couldn't help feel that he was shamed by having his hand refused the first time.

I thought about how some people don't look anyone in the eye unless they feel safe with them. I understand that for them it would be hard to look a homeless person in the eye. I get that. Still, I think we should do whatever we can to let the homeless know that we recognize them as human beings. I think the lady who didn't want to shake the gentleman's hand this morning should not stand where they come in or should find other volunteer activities that wouldn't put her in that position.

My only message is that the homeless aren't the problem, homelessness is. We should be dealing with it as individuals and as a community. It is a complex problem with a wide range of causes. All of the causes need to be addressed. We cannot choose one and use it as an excuse to ignore the others.

PARISH FINANCES

In order to fulfill our budget, we need to collect an average of \$12,722 in the collection basket each week. Some weeks may be higher and some lower but we need to maintain that average. Additionally, we have budgeted for an average of \$12,802 to be contributed monthly through our Online Giving contribution program.

The total amount budgeted through these sources is \$660,095 this year. Our budget includes another \$106,384 expected income from other sources; (Annual Catholic Appeal rebates, Christmas & Easter collections, Sacramental Donations, Interest, One-time gifts & bequests, etc.).

GOSPEL MEDITATION: Transfiguration of the Lord

"This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him." Oh, to be on that mountain! What a priceless experience for Peter, James, and John. If they had ever doubted, if they wondered whether Jesus was really who he said he was, their confidence surely got a boost on the day of the Transfiguration. Before their very eyes, Jesus' divine beauty radiated gloriously while the two ancient prophets also appeared in miraculous manner. And to top it off, the voice of God the Father spoke from the heavens and confirmed that it was all true: Jesus really is the Son of God!

Why did Jesus reveal himself in such a remarkable way to these men? Perhaps we have an answer in today's epistle. Peter writes, "We ourselves heard this voice come from heaven while we were with him on the holy mountain." Peter mentions this fact in order to confirm his credibility as a preacher as he goes on to say, "We possess the prophetic message that is altogether reliable. You will do well to be attentive to it." Because of the mission that Peter had to help shape and nurture the Church in its earliest days, his position as an "eyewitness" to the Transfiguration helped to gain the attention, and the faith, of his hearers.

So although we were not there during this holy apparition, we have the benefit of it. We, and the faithful through the ages, have heard the testimony that Jesus is truly our God from those who saw in person that it was for real. In this way, the Transfiguration is able to bolster the faith of many, not just the three men who were there that day. May we have the grace to allow the feast we celebrate today to truly deepen our faith.

WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC TRADITIONS EXPLAINED

Question: On August 10 we celebrate the feast of St. Lawrence. Can you tell us a bit about him?

Answer: Little is known about Lawrence other than he was a deacon during the reign of Emperor Valerian from 253-259. In 258, Valerian began a persecution of the Roman Church. Lawrence was in charge of the purse for the church of Rome. Roman officials demanded that the riches of the church be handed over to them. Lawrence asked for a few days to gather them.

Lawrence took the money he had charge over and distributed it to the poor of Rome. Then he gathered all the homeless and poor together. When the officials came again demanding the riches of the church, Lawrence pointed to the destitute and homeless, saying that these were the true riches of the church. For this he was imprisoned and tortured, and put to death by burning on a gridiron. It is said that as he was dying, he told his executioners to turn him over because he was done on one side and needed to be fully cooked for the Lord.

Lawrence continues to be a model for us today. The church needs continual reminders that its riches are the people. The primary purpose and mission of the church is to be continually sensitive to the needs of all God's people, most especially the least of our brothers and sisters.

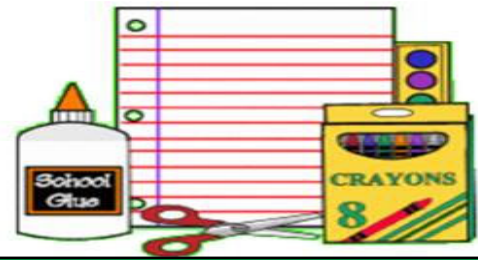

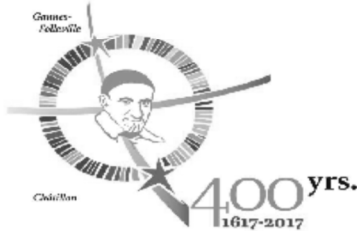
