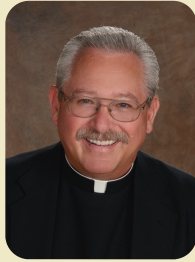

From the Pastor



Dear parishioners,

It is inappropriate to take Scripture out of context and apply it to a situation to which it was never meant to speak. I don't care if the preacher can use the word "pastor" in front of his name or not, God has not given president Trump the authority to take out Kim Jong Un.

Even if his judgement that Kim Jong Un is evil is correct, that is not what Romans 13 is talking about.

Romans 13 is talking about the relationship between citizens and their government. And, it is talking about the relationship between citizens and their government 2,000 years ago. It supported the theory of the divine right of kings which was aimed at instilling obedience by explaining why all social ranks were religiously and morally obliged to obey their government. This was used by monarchical governments but has been supplanted today by republics.

This misapplication of Scripture has been used throughout history to support wrong. In the US it was used to support the right to enslave our brothers and sisters. I hope no one today would accept that use of Scripture.

And the Christian Scriptures are not the only ones that are misread and misapplied. From what I've read, radical Islam misuses the Koran to support its radical theories and the evil that follows.

I don't know of any place in Scripture which speaks of the proper relationship between one country and another. Even if it did, it would have to be taken within the context of the entirety of Scripture, especially the Gospels. The Gospels are pretty non-violent and admonish us to love our enemies and do good to those who harm us. How do we live that out?

On the other hand an argument could be made that we should protect those who are being harmed by a foreign government. If Kim Jong Un were committing atrocities like the Pol Pot regime in Cambodia in the late 70's an argument could be made that he should be stopped.

PARISH FINANCES

In order to fulfill our budget, we need to collect an average of \$12,722 in the collection basket each week. Some weeks may be higher and some lower but we need to maintain that average. Additionally, we have budgeted for an average of \$12,802 to be contributed monthly through our Online Giving contribution program.

The total amount budgeted through these sources is \$660,095 this year. Our budget includes another \$106,384 expected income from other sources; (Annual Catholic Appeal rebates, Christmas & Easter collections, Sacramental Donations, Interest, One-time gifts & bequests, etc.).

GOSPEL MEDITATION: 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time

"Peter got out of the boat and began to walk on the water toward Jesus. But when he saw how strong the wind was, he became frightened." How can we describe Peter? At once faithful and fearful, his jumbled responses remind us that he was no spiritual superman, well intentioned though he may have been. Peter wanted to believe, and in fact showed a great deal of confidence in Christ, but the temptation to doubt was strong enough to knock him off his feet, literally.

"O you of little faith, why did you doubt?" Jesus reprimanded Peter. The words seem harsh. After all, Peter was the only one who had enough faith to even try something as ludicrous as stepping out of the boat onto the water in the first place. But perhaps Jesus wanted to emphasize that our faith needs to be strong enough to weather the storm, so to speak. If we only believe in Jesus when the wind is calm and the waves are gone, is that truly having faith in him? Is that actually trusting in his supreme power over the forces of the universe? Peter began to sink as soon as a challenge appeared. Jesus called him, and he calls us, to stay on our feet even when the winds begin to blow.

So, what are the winds that threaten our faith? What kinds of gusts are blowing today? Whatever it might be--health problems, financial concerns, relational struggles--none of it is too much for Jesus to handle. But we must step out in faith and trust him! And we need to keep our eyes on him as we do so, instead of getting distracted by the force of the challenges we face. Jesus is bigger than any problem. We have nothing to fear as long as we are

WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC TRADITIONS EXPLAINED

Question: What are we celebrating on the feast of the Assumption of Mary?

Answer: The Assumption, along with the Immaculate Conception, are two Marian dogmas that have been infallibly defined by the Church. The Assumption proclaims the reality that Mary was taken up body and soul into heaven. This was God's special gift to her in response to her total giving of self to God's plan and will.

The Church believes that Mary was immaculately conceived, that is, conceived without original sin. This led the Church to believe that she did not suffer one of the key consequences of original sin--death and corruption. (The Orthodox Church celebrates the Dormition of Mary, the belief that Mary did not die but rather fell asleep and was thus assumed into heaven.)

What significance does this feast have for our lives as Christians today? Modeling ourselves on Jesus is certainly the sure path to God. Thus this feast is above all an assurance and hope of our continued life with God. God will not leave us orphaned or alone to suffer the emptiness of death. This is the hope and assurance that Mary's assumption celebrates. It is a celebration of OUR assumption as well. She is one of us, providing a model of what God has in store for all who love and give of themselves to God.

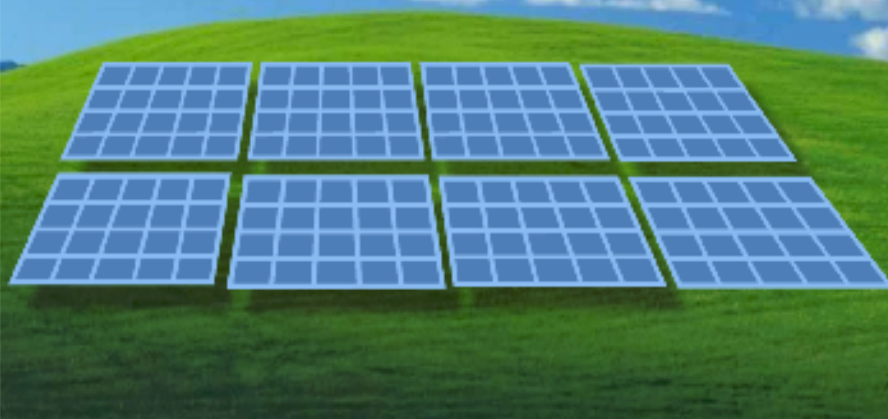

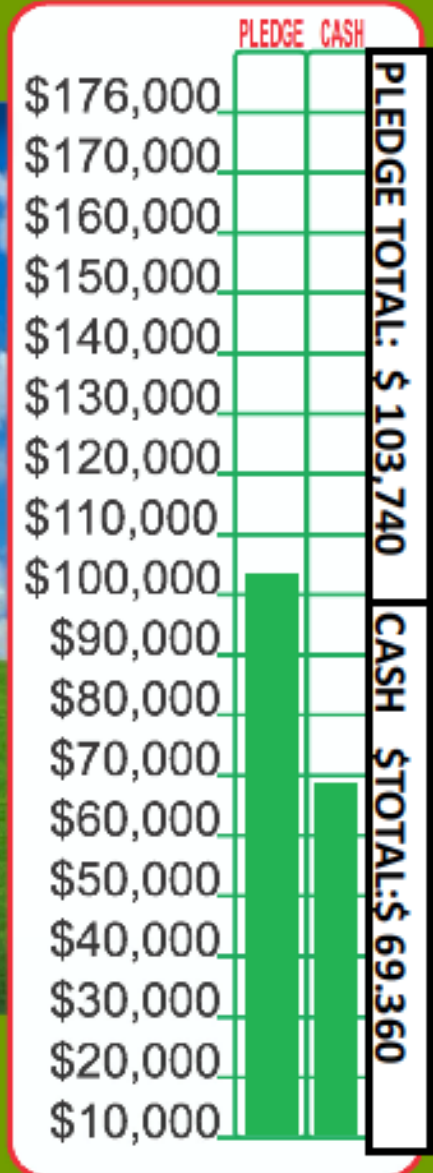
