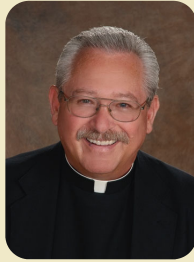

From the Pastor



Dear parishioners,

The project I spoke about, after Mass last week, is a collaborative effort with three elementary schools in the lowest income areas of El Cajon, the Grossmont Community College District, City and County departments, agencies that serve the poor and the El Cajon Collaborative. Our connection to it is through the Collaborative, of which we are now a member.

We got involved with the Collaborative through our *Bridges Out of Poverty* project. We held three workshops here at St. Luke for city and county representative, agency personnel, health care and educational personnel, other churches, etc. Several member organizations of the Collaborative were present and volunteered, along with others, to serve on an Organizing Group tasked with determining the best way to implement the *Bridges Out of Poverty* model in El Cajon. We have chosen the Collaborative to coordinate our efforts.

Recently, a grant announcement was published by the U.S. Department of Education. The grant is for project which will serve all age groups in poor neighborhoods, cradle to career, as they say. The grant also wishes to fund collaborative efforts which build on moneys already committed in those neighborhoods. It is a sizeable grant, up to \$6,000,000 per year for five years, because it will fund several organizations. One of our Organizing Group members brought the grant to our attention because it seems like a perfect fit for El Cajon and the work the schools and other agencies are already doing. The Bridges model will be a great asset to their work.

One of the assets we, The Church of St. Luke, brought to the table was our connection with Catholic Charities and our effort to get them to join in the project with us. On Friday, as I said, they agreed to be the grant applicant and fiscal agent. Because of their size and history of working with federal grants, they are the perfect applicant. We also acquired an excellent grant writer on Friday and we are on our way.

If you are interested in finding out more about the *Bridges Out of Poverty* model, I suggest you participate in the workshop we are having on August 23, 2017. It is oriented toward looking at the reality of living in poverty and hopefully will help us, who don't live that reality, begin to develop an understanding of those who do.

If you're thinking that they should understand us, we're working on that also. In September we begin a 16 week series of facilitated learning sessions to help people living in poverty look at the reality of their own situation, see what the other side is like, investigate what would be necessary for them to stabilize their own situation; and, learn how to work more effectively with people in the middle class who run the agencies, staff the educational institutions, provide jobs, etc.

Please pray for the fruitfulness of our efforts.

PARISH FINANCES

In order to fulfill our budget, we need to collect an average of \$12,722 in the collection basket each week. Some weeks may be higher and some lower but we need to maintain that average. Additionally, we have budgeted for an average of \$12,802 to be contributed monthly through our Online Giving contribution program.

The total amount budgeted through these sources is \$660,095 this year. Our budget includes another \$106,384 expected income from other sources; (Annual Catholic Appeal rebates, Christmas & Easter collections, Sacramental Donations, Interest, One-time gifts & bequests, etc.).

GOSPEL MEDITATION: 20th Sunday in Ordinary Time

"O woman, great is your faith! Let it be done for you as you wish." This woman was an outsider. She was a Canaanite, not an Israelite, and as such she would have been considered ritually unclean. But she approached Jesus nonetheless and asked for his help. And Jesus used this opportunity to teach his disciples an important lesson.

In the verses directly before today's passage, Jesus had told Peter that what defiles a person comes from the heart, not from ignoring external purity practices. Then, Jesus traveled with his disciples from Galilee to the region of Tyre and Sidon where they were much more likely to encounter someone considered to be unclean.

At first it appeared that Jesus wasn't going to acknowledge the woman who begged for help. His comment, "It is not right to take the food of the children and throw it to the dogs," was a common comparison between Jews (the children) and Canaanites (the dogs). But, in fact, Jesus said this only to go right ahead and break this social code! He showed by his actions that it did not matter whether someone was Jewish or not, what mattered was the faith in a person's heart. And this woman proved to Jesus and the doubting disciples that she had great faith. How many others would have even approached Jesus to ask for his help? How many others would have persevered when he appeared unresponsive? By pausing in his response, and first mentioning the standard reply, Jesus gave this woman the opportunity to demonstrate her great faith. And then, he answered her request and praised her extraordinary faith. What a lesson for his prejudiced disciples! And what a lesson for us, both to persevere in faith, and never to judge others on mere appearances.

LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

Our relationships often need reconciling and healing. While it is easy to say, it is often difficult to achieve. Sometimes, reconciling requires that we take down the barriers that are sources of division, remove our prejudices, look beyond differences, and see the "sameness" that connects us one to another. Of course, each party has to be willing to do this in order for healing to occur. Our Gospel shows us the healing that can occur when both parties are willing participants.

WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC TRADITIONS EXPLAINED

Question: A member of my parish was recently arrested for a white-collar crime. I don't approve of what he did, but he is a great neighbor and a nice person. How should I treat someone like him?

Answer: There is a litany of expressions that fit this situation: Everyone makes mistakes. Hate the sin, love the sinner. Judge not, lest you be judged. All of these proverbs and sayings highlight the fact that we are here to help each other on the way to salvation. Our hope and goal is that everyone grows in grace, drawing closer to God and to the promise of eternal life. Part of that process is our struggle, collectively and individually, with sin. And that is the ugly part. Sin is not nice, pretty, or inviting when laid out for all to see. Nor is it easy for the person caught in the spotlight.

Kindness and support are not the same thing as approval. We recognize that good people can do bad things and in their struggle, they need the help of others. Our kindness is often the flicker of hope that allows someone to face the consequences of sin while focusing on the promise of redemption. Your desire to help and support your neighbor is the response of grace to sin, and the same response of Jesus to us.

CANCELLATION CHARGES: In the unfortunate event a participant must cancel travel, notice to AmaWaterways must be via email, which must include a return receipt and read notation, or other writing stating clearly and correctly each guest's name, ship name, start and end date of the cruise and a brief statement of the reason for cancellation. Other forms of notice are not sufficient. The effective date of the cancellation is the date we receive the written cancellation notice. A name change or substitution of participant is also treated as a cancellation in that all cancellation charges apply. Cancellation charges are per-person, based on the cancellation date, as follows: after Group Review Date and up to 121 days before departure: \$200 per person loss of deposit; 120-90 days before departure: \$400 per person loss of deposit; 89-60 days before departure: 35% of cruise and land price; 59-30 days before departure: 50% of cruise and land price; 29-7 days before departure: 80% of cruise and land price; 6 days or less before departure: 100% of cruise and land price. 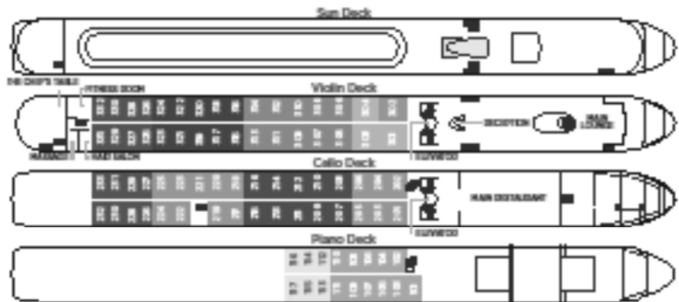
