

### From the Pastor

Dear parishioners,

After my homily a few weeks ago, I was told that some people are confused about the concept of transubstantiation. It is too big of a subject to deal with in a homily, so here is a short explanation. If you have more questions, contact me.

The sixth chapter of John is all about the real presence. The concept of transubstantiation is all about the real presence. But, the concept is not about how it happens. It is about what happens. To treat the concept of transubstantiation as a scientific theory about how our Lord's presence in the Eucharist comes about is to fall prey to what the sixth chapter of Johns warns us; it is thinking in worldly, physical, terms while our Lord's words are "spirit".

Is our Lord physically present in the Eucharist? Well, if you consider Him physically present as the accidents of bread and wine, then yes but that is not what the concept of transubstantiation is about. The concept of transubstantiation is about His real presence, His substance, being present in the Eucharist. I even have trouble saying He is present in the Eucharist because His presence "is" the Eucharist; you hear me say that at almost every Mass.

Does that mean He is not bodily present? No. His "body and blood together with [the] whole Divinity of our Lord Jesus Christ and, therefore the whole Christ, is truly, really and substantially contained in the Sacrament of the Most Holy Eucharist" as stated by the Council of Trent. Does that mean His physical body? No, it means His resurrected body which is not restrained by space and time like our physical worldly bodies are. St. Paul calls it a spiritual body in 1 Corinthians 15:44. What that is, precisely, is a mystery to us but we will experience it in our own resurrection.

Chapter six warns us to stop thinking in worldly terms. The problem with thinking in worldly terms is portrayed several times, first when the people were fed and wanted to make Jesus king, next when the apostles tried to get him into their boat, next when the people grumbled about how He could say He came down from heaven, then when they grumbled about how He could give them His body and blood. Finally, that worldly thinking results in their not having faith in Him and their leaving Him to return to their former way of life.

I think the "why" transubstantiation happens is way more important than what happens or how it happens. The why is all about the Lord wanting to nourish us with His very self that we might share in His divinity and, therefore, become more fully human by restoring in us the image and likeness of God as it was before the fall of Adam. His way of saying it is "My words are spirit and life."

Let us believe and open ourselves to this transformation.

## ♥ GOSPEL MEDITATION ♥ ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

September 9, 2018 - 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

"Jesus...went by way of Sidon...into the district of the Decapolis." For most of Jesus' ministry, he remains in Galilee and areas with a predominantly Jewish population. Today, however, we see Jesus traveling through a heavily pagan area. This makes the utterance of faith in today's Gospel all the more astounding. "He has done all things well."

In this story, a deaf man is brought to Jesus. This man is not without community! Despite communication difficulties due to a speech impediment, his people bring him before Jesus. Jesus lays hands upon the man and commands his broken body to change. "Be opened! Immediately the man's ears were opened, his speech impediment was removed, and he spoke plainly." The community is stunned. They can't stop telling the story. The more Jesus asks them to settle down, the more they proclaim! The Jewish people expected a Messiah but a Messiah with very particular qualifications. The Greeks and pagans anticipated no such savior. There were no expectations to meet. They had a special capacity to be completely, utterly surprised.


As Catholics, it can be easy to become accustomed to the songs and the prayers, to the routine of religious education drop-offs and Sunday Mass attendance. By now, we may have very particular expectations. When was the last time you allowed yourself to be surprised by God? Sometimes we are all like the deaf man in today's Gospel. God wants to speak to us, but we can't hear clearly. In your prayer this week, go before God honestly. Give yourself permission to drop your expectations and assumptions. Ask Him to renew your faith to show you how, in your life, "He has done all things well."
