From the Pastor



Dear Parishioners,

A month or so ago, I wrote about attitudes toward the homeless. I think I mentioned what I thought were inappropriate attitudes I experienced at a meeting of the East County Homeless Task Force. I also think I mentioned that the news reported that we hired the former head of the homelessness efforts from Salt Lake City who had “cleaned up Salt Lake City’s homeless problem” (that is a loose quote from memory). Then I went on to say that I visited Salt Lake City and didn’t see any change. I had talked to businesses in the Rio Grande district who also said there had been no change.

Well, they are trying to change things. They are running a three-phase effort called Operation Rio Grande. You can google it to see what is going on. The thing I like about it is the words and phrases they are using are not making an enemy out of the homeless. In fact, they say they are trying to help the homeless.

From some of the reporting, it appears that some of the enforcement efforts are going against their stated goals; that happens. And, there are many detractors who decry the treatment of the homeless as inappropriate; that will always happen too. My prayer is that they stick to their stated goals; protect the homeless from the criminal element (drug dealers), get treatment for homeless alcoholics and addicts and provide training and employment for those striving to improve their lives.

I saw a documentary, once, about homelessness in the L.A. Skid Row district. The homeless there were saying how happy they were that the city cleaned the area up and got rid of the drugs and violence. I hope that happens in Salt Lake and I hope we can make it happen here.

One of the problems I think about is that, as the East County Homeless Task Force said, 50% of our homeless have serious mental illness. The national rate is said to be up to 30%, depending on who you ask. Mental illness and alcohol/drug addiction go hand-in-hand and people with mental illness may have the most difficulty dealing with their addiction, even when they want to. What do we do for them, long term?

Another question I have is what kind of job training will the cities provide? Will the motivation to improve their situation come from within the individual or will it be externally imposed? Will the training include help learning to communicate with the middle-class people who will be hiring and managing them? Will there be efforts to increase all of the resources, not just financial, needed to “make it” in our world. Especially, will there be efforts to increase their social capital (appropriate friends, mentors, etc.) to journey with them on their road to stability?

I think all of these things are important if we are going to work toward stability for people living in poverty and stability for our community for the long term. That is what our *Bridges* effort is trying to do, as we work with the El Cajon Community Collaborative and local schools. Our first 16 week *Getting Ahead* experience for people living in poverty will begin in early October. Please pray for the presenters and for the families who will be taking part as investigators. They will be investigating their current situation, the situation of those living a more stable lifestyle and what resources are available to them to move into a more stable lifestyle themselves.

In order to fulfill our budget, we need to collect an average of \$12,722 in the collection basket each week. Some weeks may be higher and some lower but we need to maintain that average. Additionally, we have budgeted for an average of \$12,802 to be contributed monthly through our Online Giving contribution program.

The total amount budgeted through these sources is \$660,095 this year. Our budget includes another \$106,384 expected income from other sources; (Annual Catholic Appeal rebates, Christmas & Easter collections, Sacramental Donations, Interest, One-time gifts & bequests, etc.).

GOSPEL MEDITATION: 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time

"Amen, I say to you, tax collectors and prostitutes are entering the kingdom of God before you." Ouch. This had to sting. Jesus spoke these shocking words not just to anybody. He spoke them to "the chief priests and elders of the people." The ones who were professional law-keepers. The ones who were religious leaders and teachers. The ones who were, in truth, self-righteous, pompous, and presumptuous. Jesus must have known how offensive it would be to his audience to share this unpleasant fact. But he said it anyway because he knew they needed to hear it.

But the point wasn't to offend. The point was to AMEND. Jesus was urging them to change their lives for the better, to come to God with a humble, contrite heart, seeking forgiveness and mercy. These unrepentant upper-crust leaders were plagued by an inability to see their own sins. They were far too focused on identifying where others were going wrong. And, as was his style, Jesus' preaching was adapted according to his audience. These guys needed to get knocked out of their complacency. So Jesus did what he had to do.

It's important to realize, by the way, that the reason tax collectors and prostitutes were leading the line to heaven wasn't because of their sins. It was because of their sorrow. The people Jesus had in mind when he mentioned this--like Zacchaeus and Mary Magdalene perhaps--had repented from their sinful behavior and begun anew. This is why he praises them. And this is what the Lord longs to see everyone doing, including us. Either we need to acknowledge and repent of our sins, or we are placing ourselves in the same category as the pharisaical priests and elders. And that's definitely not the place to be.

LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

Saying and doing are two very different things. Often, we say we are going to do the right thing but then we do not. We get distracted by a self-focused concern, apathy, fear, and a number of other excuses. The choice to act with virtue is always before us. The ability to choose is one of God's gifts. Fully living the Gospel means that we choose to "practice what we preach." Faith without action serves no purpose.

WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC TRADITIONS EXPLAINED

Question: My coworkers and I have been debating the death penalty and whether or not it should be part of our justice system. Why are so many people who claim to be pro-life believers in favor of it?

Answer: The issues of crime and punishment are never easy because so many factors influence people and how they view problems and solutions. Increased violence, loss of life, cost to taxpayers and the community at large, and the maneuverings of lawyers and courts only add fuel to the fire. When bad things happen in your neighborhood or to your home or to you, you want relief. Any normal person would feel that way. A pro-life view does not insulate anyone from the bad effects of criminal behavior. Innocent people are hurt every day and it may seem as though those who cause the pain get away with it, or get off easy.

The death penalty is not excluded by Church teaching. The state has the right to impose penalties that are commensurate with the crime as well as to defend itself from further harm (Catechism of the Catholic Church, §2266). When possible, punishment should help correct the offender, offering a chance of redemption, which is why the pope and bishops have called for an end to the death penalty.
