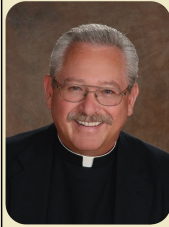

*From the Pastor*



Dear parishioners,

I've heard negative comments from several parishioners about the column I wrote two weeks ago concerning our need to look at the underlying issues of the Black Lives Matter movement. Some people felt that I was taking a stand for Black Lives Matter against our police. That is literally not true and I even said "We don't have to take sides against anybody. We must side with both the black community and our police if we are ever going to solve the problem. It is not going to be solved by creating greater divisions, or laying blame, or anything else that doesn't bring us together." If we don't solve the problem, we don't make our police any safer. If we make the problem worse, we make our police less safe.

One person said I should not be mixing our Church in with politics. I wasn't. Just because politicians have weighed in on the Anthem kneeling matter, doesn't make it political for anyone except them, depending on how they weigh in. I don't think President Trump is making it political, by the way. He is just weighing in on the issue and he happens to be a politician. I haven't heard that he is making it a Democrats vs Republicans issue. I don't see where anyone can say there is politics involved in this.

On the other hand, if there is something going on in our country or in the world, for that matter, which is evil, then we have a duty as Christians to speak out. That is why we speak out against abortion, capital punishment or anything else that damages human life, from inception to natural death. That comes from our official understanding of the Fifth Commandment against killing. To say that we shouldn't speak out on that because it is a political issue is to say that the Gospel has no bearing on our corporate society. To believe that the Gospel has no place in our political society is to deny the Great Commission, "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature." (Mark 16:15)

If we feel we are compelled to make enemies of anyone who espouses that black lives matter, we need to go back and read Scripture. The story of the Good Samaritan is one of my favorites. Remember the story was in response to the young man who wanted to justify himself and asked Jesus who his neighbor, whom he had to love, was. Jesus responded that it was his enemy. (It is relatively easy to google the relationship between Jews and Samaritans.) If we need something more specific we can look at Luke 6:27-28 "...love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you. Or we can look at Matthew 5:43 or we can look at Romans 12:20-21 which ends with "...conquer evil with good."

Our society matters and we are called to work toward changing it in the manner of the Gospel. If we want our police and our children and our parents and grandparents or anyone else to be safe we must commit ourselves to bringing an end to the fear and the hatred and division that is plaguing our country.

Maybe it is just perceptions which need to change. If we don't try, we'll find nothing and the situation won't get any better.

## PARISH FINANCES

In order to fulfill our budget, we need to collect an average of \$12,722 in the collection basket each week. Some weeks may be higher and some lower but we need to maintain that average. Additionally, we have budgeted for an average of \$12,802 to be contributed monthly through our Online Giving contribution program.

The total amount budgeted through these sources is \$660,095 this year. Our budget includes another \$106,384 expected income from other sources; (Annual Catholic Appeal rebates, Christmas & Easter collections, Sacramental Donations, Interest, One-time gifts & bequests, etc.).

### GOSPEL MEDITATION: 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time

"The whole law and the prophets depend on these two commandments." Jesus gives us a simple moral principle in today's Gospel. He speaks about two kinds of love: love of God and love of neighbor. He tells us that all the other laws and teachings of our faith fall under these two headings. So if we can master these, we will be in good spiritual shape!

First of all, regarding the love of God, Jesus tells us in essence that we must love God completely and entirely, with our whole being--heart, soul, and mind. If we are holding back from a full commitment to God, then we are falling short of this vision. So we would do well to examine ourselves and find those trouble spots where we are hesitant to give God everything. Is there a relationship we hold in our heart that is somehow separating us from God, either by negative association, lingering bitterness, or a kind of idol-worship of the relationship itself? What about our souls? Are we deeply attached to any pastimes, pleasures, or pursuits that cloud our soul from clearly welcoming the presence of God? An examination of our minds is in order as well. How do we direct our thoughts? Do we strive to form our conscience and understanding in the truth, or do we passively allow public opinion or popular consensus to direct our conclusions about the Church, the world, and our own identity?

It follows that the closer we come to loving God with our whole being, the better we will be at loving our neighbors. The more we are filled with God's love, the more that love radiates out to those around us, and the less we concern ourselves about what we can get out of the deal. So let us truly love God, and all the rest will follow.

### LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

God insists that we treat each other with fairness and love. No compromise is offered here. The great commandment is specific: love God, neighbor, and self. Who is my neighbor? It is not just the person sitting next to me today or the people who live next door. Our neighbor is everyone, especially those most in need: those alien to you or to our country, those who are poor, alone, or abandoned, and even those who are the greatest of sinners. We really struggle with how to live these words. How do we open ourselves to the stranger, the immigrant, those who harm us, those in need, or those with whom we disagree? Pope Francis gives excellent guidance here. We are challenged to stretch our thinking and become more unconditional with others as God is unconditional with us.

### WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC TRADITIONS EXPLAINED

**Question:** Would optional celibacy help the priest shortage?

**Answer:** This is a hotly debated topic. There are good arguments on both sides, and there is no clear answer that emerges. However, the shortage of clergy in denominations that do allow marriage would seem to indicate that optional celibacy is not the quick answer that some might think. No one solution is perfect. Each one has its flaws and problems that are not easily solved. While optional celibacy would open ordination to some great men who are married, it also brings the problems of family, financial support, marital problems, and issues--good and bad--of childrearing. So it would not seem that optional celibacy is a realistic solution to the shortage of clergy.

With all of the varied challenges and problems facing the Church, it is easy to forget that the Holy Spirit leads us. Openness, dialogue, and education are second to our prayers and petitions to the Holy Spirit to make clear the path the Church should follow. A response that is rooted in a culture of political correctness is almost certainly doomed; a response that is rooted in prayer and in God cannot fail.
