

#### From the Pastor



Dear Parishioners,

I'm writing the Sunday before Thanksgiving. I realize that you will read this the Sunday after Thanksgiving, but such is life. I can't seem to get my act together enough to plan these properly.

I like the concept of thanksgiving because like David Steindl-Rast, I believe that gratefulness is the heart of prayer (One of his books on

spirituality is entitled Gratefulness, The Heart of Prayer). Developing an "attitude of gratitude," as they say, helps us identify God's actions in our lives. Identifying His action in our lives, and thanking Him for it, should help us develop a personal relationship with the God who loves us enough to be involved in our lives.

I imagine that the Mayflower settlers felt tremendous gratitude toward God when the celebrated the harvest festival that we normally think of as the first Thanksgiving. They were thankful for the harvest they had. They were thankful for the wheat and the corn harvest. The barley evidently was so-so and the peas "not worth gathering". They were also thankful for the help of the natives who celebrated with them.

They didn't call their harvest festival "Thanksgiving" and they didn't celebrate it every year after that. Individual colonies, and after that states, declared thanksgiving celebrations on an irregular basis. It wasn't that they weren't thankful; they identified special things for which to be thankful and declared a celebration to honor it. It was a time when faith and the civil life mixed and faith guided the declaration of these feasts.

It wasn't until 1863 that Abraham Lincoln, in the midst of the Civil Way, declared Thanksgiving as a national holiday. He asked everyone to ask God to "commend to his tender care all those who have become widows, orphans, mourners or sufferers in the lamentable civil strife" and to "heal the wounds of the nation." I imagine that the thanksgiving was, in part, anticipation of God answering their prayers.

This is one civil feast which makes sense to me to be celebrated religiously. As we celebrate it, it might be nice to remember that our nation, for a large part of our history, connected our faith with our civil life. That seems in sharp contrast, to me, with the attitude, today, that religion and politics shouldn't mix.

Of course they should mix. We should pray for our civil society. We should analyze the political issues of our day in line with Gospel teachings and we should work toward remaking our civil society more-and-more in line with Gospel values. We should work toward God's will being done in our world, not just within the confines of our Church.

It seems to me that our time is similar, in some ways, to the time of Abraham Lincoln. His prayer that the wounds of the nation be healed does not seem to be fully answered yet. We may not be fighting a war with guns but we seem to be fighting a war of words and attitudes and accusations and misinformation, etc. We should continue to pray to God during this lamentable civil strife.

The end of the Civil War, obviously, did not put an end to the conflict; conflicts wherein one wide wins and one side loses never do. Let us pray for an end to the civil strife we carry on today in a manner which will bring us together rather than drive the conflict underground again. For this we need God's help. Let us thank Him in advance and open ourselves to His help.

#### **™ PARISH FINANCES ™**

In order to fulfill our budget, we need to collect an average of \$12,722 in the collection basket each week. Some weeks may be higher and some lower but we need to maintain that average. Additionally, we have budgeted for an average of \$12,802 to be contributed monthly through our Online Giving contribution program.

The total amount budgeted through these sources is \$660,095 this year. Our budget includes another \$106,384 expected income from other sources; (Annual Catholic Appeal rebates, Christmas & Easter collections, Sacramental Donations, Interest, One-time gifts & bequests, etc.).


