



## FROM: THE PASTOR



Dear Parishioners,

This last Saturday, my cousin, who was visiting from Ohio, volunteered at the *Desayunador Salesiano* in Tijuana. *Desayunador*, in this case, is probably best translated as “breakfast hall” or “breakfast table”. It’s like a soup kitchen which serves breakfast to the poor. It is run by the Salesian fathers and utilizes many volunteers to serve about 1,100 breakfasts per day.

Saturday the clients received a glass of juice, a donut, a plate of what looked to me like carne mechada with beans and tortillas. There was also coffee which my cousin and I were in charge of. I didn’t spill too much but yes, I made a mess which had to be mopped up.

There were quite a few young people volunteering also. They were part of a Confirmation class from one of the local parishes. I was really impressed with their maturity, their kindness to Katie and I and their kindness to the clients. They treated the clients as I suppose they would treat any other person they were serving whether rich, poor, important, marginalized or whatever type of person. They treated them like human beings, God’s children, and engaged them like human beings.

I’m glad that Katy and I went. We had visited Padre Jesus, who runs the place, a few days earlier and I committed to helping out on Tuesday mornings. Katie was returning to Ohio on Sunday but she wanted to help out before she went back so we went in on Saturday. I learned that Padre Jesus had put me on the schedule to preside at Mass on Tuesday. Otherwise, I would have shown up not knowing that it was expected of me and the staff not knowing who I am. Since I wouldn’t have identified myself as a priest it may have been quite confusing with them thinking the priest didn’t show up and me not knowing I was the priest who didn’t show up.

Yes, the staff and volunteers start with Mass at 7:00 am which is so appropriate since the Mass is when we ask the Holy Spirit to make our Lord’s self-sacrifice present to our day and time and when we are invited to join the sacrifice of our lives to His. What a great offering to make to God, our service to His people.

Another thing which impressed me was the seeming lack of embarrassment or humiliation experienced by the clientele. They looked me in the eye and interacted with me as an equal. I am hugely pleased about that and I guess it is because the staff and volunteers at the *Desayunador* treat them as equals.

The reason I wanted to volunteer at the *Desayunador* in the first place is that I watched a documentary and now have met several people who were deported from the U.S. into a very desperate situation. In many, many cases they were people who entered the U.S. as undocumented aliens when they were children or teenagers and became productive, albeit “illegal”, members of our society. They ran businesses, married U.S. citizens or had children who are automatically U.S. citizens and then were found out and deported after twenty plus years. (I placed quotation marks around the word illegal because while descriptive of the situation it includes emotional overtones which I prefer we didn’t employ when speaking of undocumented immigrants.)

People in this situation are also on a ten year punitive ban from applying for a visa to re-enter the U.S. If they are returned to Mexico on a Border Patrol provided bus, any identification they have is taken away which makes them undocumented in Mexico also and results in their arrest and jailing. Once released, they are simply released to the streets.

I personally have compassion for people in this situation and wish to somehow be an instrument of God’s love for them during a period of their lives which must be very difficult. I pray that they, and the other people served at *Desayunador*, will eventually find their way in the world, a better way than that which they must travel today.

## PARISH FINANCES

In order to fulfill our budget, we need to collect an average of \$12,722 in the collection basket each week. Some weeks may be higher and some lower but we need to maintain that average. Additionally, we have budgeted for an average of \$12,802 to be contributed monthly through our Online Giving contribution program.

The total amount budgeted through these sources is \$660,095 this year. Our budget includes another \$106,384 expected income from other sources; (Annual Catholic Appeal rebates, Christmas & Easter collections, Sacramental Donations, Interest, One-time gifts & bequests, etc.).

## TOWARD HEALTHY RELATIONSHIPS

From the beginning of creation, God intended for people to live together in relationship with one another. Much of scripture shows us how to do this as it illustrates and clarifies God's plans. The readings this weekend guide us in the value and care of our relationships. Specifically, the Gospel focuses on the circumstances of failed relationships. Unlike the Pharisees, we would do well not to focus on the laws that pertain to failed relationships, but concentrate instead on what God really intended for us. Healthy bonds require a lot of our time and energy. They certainly require trust and honesty. Jesus demonstrated a deep commitment to his friends and to us. As our brother, he gave his very life for us. Children work hard at friendships. They trust, forgive, and love without conditions. The final words of today's Gospel invite us to welcome Jesus and the people of our relationships with the fresh enthusiasm of a child. Copyright © J. S. Paluch

## TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The old world of what we call canonical penance, or the extraordinary one-time public repentance of sinners, began to collapse with the conversion of Constantine in the early fourth century. It tottered for a hundred years or so and then virtually disappeared. It served an isolated and persecuted church well, but once people began seeking baptism for economic and political privilege, a real pastoral crisis exploded. There were more lukewarm Christians afoot, and some "barbarians" rampaging through the ruins accepted baptism just because their leaders did.

As the old structures collapsed, people who still sought some sort of public conversion scampered off to the desert to live in monastic isolation. Penance disappeared from the parish scene, and the old bench where hungry penitents used to beg for prayers was empty. Some bishops faced the crisis by inventing alternate means of discipline, all more private than public. A person might be asked to refrain from receiving Communion for a time, or even to accept some sort of corporal punishment (the pedigree of the stocks and scarlet letters of colonial America). This had the effect of separating the sinner from the prayerful intercession of the gathered church, and made an already bad situation worse. Before long, the pastoral system of penance was in a shambles, and sadly irrelevant to ordinary Christians.—Rev. James Field




