REFLECTION ON TODAY'S GOSPEL

After the master of the house has arisen and locked the door, then will you stand outside knocking and saying, 'Lord, open the door for us.' Then he will say to you, 'I do not know where (you) are from. Depart from me, all you evildoers!' And people will come from the east and the west and from the north and the south and will recline at table in the kingdom of God. Lk 13:25-29

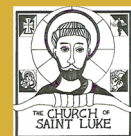

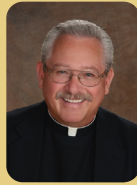

From the Pastor



Dear parishioners,

In her book *A Framework for Understanding Poverty*, Ruby Payne talks about defining poverty as being under resourced. She looks at a variety of resources, more than just the financial, the absence of which, alone, is often used to define poverty. She states, "The ability to leave poverty is more dependent upon other resources than upon financial resources."

Two of those other resources are of particular interest to me as we embark upon creating a Bridges Initiative in our East County communities. Here is her discussion of those two:

Support systems are resources. To whom does one go when help is needed? Those individuals who are available and who will help are resources. When the child is sick and you have to be at work—who takes care of the child? Where do you go when the money is short and you need medicine? Support systems are not just about meeting financial or emotional needs. They are about knowledge bases as well. How do you get into college? Who sits and listens when you are rejected? Who helps you negotiate the mountains of paper? Who assists you with your algebra homework when you don't know how to do it? Those people are all support systems.

Relationships/role models are resources. All individuals have role models. The question is the extent to which the role model is nurturing and appropriate. Can the role model parent? Work successfully? Provide a gender role for the individual? It is largely from role models that a person learns to live life emotionally.

Part of the Bridges Initiative will be a sixteen-week *Getting Ahead* curriculum for under-resourced individuals. Part of that curriculum will be looking at the extent to which an individual/family has these resources and looking at which resources are available in the community. The individuals (investigators) make a plan for increasing necessary resources as they begin to work toward moving from poverty to the middle class.

The experience of other communities with this curriculum indicates that having a mentor from the middle class who understands and can articulate the hidden rules of living in the middle class and the hidden rules of living in poverty can have a significant impact on the success of the graduate as they work through their plan for increasing resources.

It appears to me that faith communities might be a perfect choice for providing mentors who can be part of the graduates' support system, who can be a role model and who, with training, can understand and articulate the hidden rules necessary for negotiating life in poverty and in the middle class. In our faith community, for example, we have many people who have done well and are knowledgeable in specific areas where graduates might want to begin increasing resources. A couple of those areas might be education, job acquisition, accessing assistance from local agencies, etc.

PARISH FINANCES

In order to fulfill our budget, we need to collect an average of \$12,722 in the collection basket each week. Some weeks may be higher and some lower but we need to maintain that average. Additionally, we have budgeted for an average of \$12,802 to be contributed monthly through our Online Giving contribution program.

The total amount budgeted through these sources is \$660,095 this year. Our budget includes another \$106,384 expected income from other sources; (Annual Catholic Appeal rebates, Christmas & Easter collections, Sacramental Donations, Interest, One-time gifts & bequests, etc.).

DISCIPLINE

It is no accident that the words “disciple” and “discipline” are nearly identical. Their relationship in Christian faith and life, however, has fallen somewhat out of favor in the past generation, as certain prescribed Church rules and regulations have been reduced and relaxed. These rules were often referred to as “disciplines.” We are mistaken, however, to think that it no longer takes discipline to follow Christ. The Letter to the Hebrews assures us of that today. Our discipline is more like that of an athlete pursuing a victory or a personal best, or a musician striving for a concert career or to master a new piece of music. This discipline comes from desire, not from regulations. It was the desire to do the will of God that led Jesus on the path to his cross. It is that same desire he encourages in us today: to strive to enter through the narrow gate, to find ourselves in the kingdom with a surprising assortment of people who are there not because of mere observation of rules, but out of a genuine desire to recline at the table of the heavenly banquet. TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

In recent decades, attention has shifted away from headgear as a symbol of a bishop’s authority to a more substantial symbol: the chair, called the *cathedra*. The word comes from the Latin word for a chair with armrests. It is exactly the reason why dining room sets were marketed in this country a few years ago with only one chair with armrests, the captain’s chair. In many rectories of a certain vintage, you will see only one chair with arms at the dining table, a sign to the assisting priests of their proper place in the constellation. For us, as with most Anglicans and some Lutherans, the *cathedra* is a sign of the teaching authority of the bishop. We inherited the symbolism of the chair from Roman civil life in the fourth century. A church that houses a *cathedra* is called a cathedral, and the chair may be used only by the bishop of that diocese. Priests who preside at liturgy there must use a different presidential chair.

You may find the *cathedra* in its most traditional place at the head of the apse, or against a side wall as was favored in medieval times, but increasingly bishops are locating the *cathedra* in the midst of the assembly of the faithful. In the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels, visitors will find no barrier to their trying out the *cathedra*, an expression of hospitality that helps the archbishop be mindful of those whom he serves. —Rev. James Field,

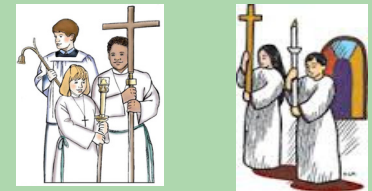
