



REFLECTION ON TODAY'S GOSPEL



From the Pastor



Dear parishioners,

Last week, *Give Us This Day* included a reflection by Karl Rahner; “He (God) must love himself in us and through us in his Holy Spirit, for our love to be worthy of him.” This immediately resonated with me which is strange because I have always found Rahner a bit difficult. But I’ve been thinking, for quite some time, about writing about God’s actions in our lives and have struggled with how to communicate it to others. I think Rahner is on to something here.

In his Confessions, sometime around 400 CE, St. Augustine said “Thou hast made us for thyself, O Lord, and our heart is restless until it finds its rest in thee.” I have always taken this to mean that God draws us to himself and, at an intellectual level, I can understand this saying but I’ve never really been able to deal with it at a feeling level. It doesn’t help me understand why God draws us to himself. Having made us for himself sounds a bit self-absorbed to me. I can’t think of God as self-absorbed.

The treatise *Abandonment to Divine Providence*, probably written in the second quarter of the 18th century and originally attributed to Jean-Pierre de Caussade states “It (the designs of God) is God working in the soul to make it like unto Himself.” He doesn’t deal with why God wants to make the soul “like unto Himself” which, like Augustine, doesn’t help me much. I feel like I need to know why God does it to believe that He does it.

The author of *Abandonment* also believes that everything which happens in life is God working to accomplish this task without us necessarily being aware of it. He seems to believe that God works at the level of minutia to accomplish His designs and His designs are accomplished when we submit to His will either knowingly or unknowingly.

I can’t imagine that God creates the minutia of my life in order to try to get me to do His will and the whole concept of “submission” is problematic for me. It seems to assume a more powerful and less powerful person in the relationship and, while that may be true of God and me, I’ve never felt that God has used His power over me. Submission to God is a basic element in the Muslim faith, by the way, and doesn’t seem to me to be very Christian.

These discussions, more than Rahner, are quite removed from my experience of life and my experience of God but Rahner, who may be saying the same thing in a different way, touched into my life experience. His expression of God loving himself in and through us made me think of how pleased I am with my children. I remember thinking, when they were young, that I need to make sure they can do relationship. I didn’t care so much if they were successful in the world’s terms but I knew I wanted them to be able to have good relationships. I didn’t know how to train them but I knew I wanted to. Thank God, they turned out pretty good and I’m proud to be their dad.

I imagine God being the same way. He created us as an expression of himself similarly, I guess, to an artist creating a great work of art; he puts himself into it. God lets us enter into the creative process and helps us as we become more and more what He created us to be, an expression of himself. I know we don’t create our children to be an expression of ourselves but we are expressing ourselves, in some way, in the act that results in children being born. It should be an expression of our love which is an expression of ourselves.

We help our children become who they are to become with other acts of love, each an expression of ourselves. And, we are delighted at many steps along the way. There is a certain self-appreciation and pride when they do well. This is what I imagine God loving himself in us and through us to be like. I know it is anthropomorphism to imagine God to be like us but it is the only way I can approach understanding God and that is why Rahner made sense to me.

Rahner gave me the basis of understanding the author of *Abandonment*. Even though I don’t think God creates the minutia in order to mold us, I believe He is always there to help us deal with living in the minutia and, in that manner, helps us be molded by our living in it. That is similar to my approach to raising children. The parents’ job is to help their child come to know themselves, the person God created, and help them be the image of their creator in a world which, often times, encourages them to be something quite different from the image of their creator.

God is still helping me and I pray that I am still becoming more and more the person He created me to be.

PARISH FINANCES

In order to fulfill our budget, we need to collect an average of \$12,722 in the collection basket each week. Some weeks may be higher and some lower but we need to maintain that average. Additionally, we have budgeted for an average of \$12,802 to be contributed monthly through our Online Giving contribution program. The total amount budgeted through these sources is \$660,095 this year. Our budget includes another \$106,384 expected income from other sources; (Annual Catholic Appeal rebates, Christmas & Easter collections, Sacramental Donations, Interest, One-time gifts & bequests, etc.).

HUMILITY

Have you ever been in a group of people—maybe on a tour, at a social gathering, or at church—and discovered that you have just been talking with a well-known author, corporate CEO, great scholar, or politician? Your first thought is the hope that you didn't say anything to embarrass yourself; but your second thought is how much they seemed like such "regular" folks. What is it that makes people seem so "regular"? Today's readings give us a clue when they stress the importance of humility.

It is so hard for us not to tell the first person who will listen how busy we are, how hard we work, how much money we donate, and how important our job titles are. We think these accolades make a difference to people, and if we don't tell them, how will they ever know? But if our actions demonstrate our values, people will recognize our worth on their own. TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Perhaps the most familiar traditional symbol that identifies bishops is the crozier that they carry. We see the shepherd's staff and immediately rich images from scripture come to mind, as well as the recollection that the first to respond to Christ's presence in our world were the shepherds. The staff is more than a walking stick; its crooked top is useful in snaring errant sheep but also in keeping the flock united. Bishops carry the curve outward, indicating their ministry to the wider flock, while abbots (and some abbesses, too) carry the crozier with the curve pointing in, indicating that their ministry is to the monastery alone.

The crozier was once also carried by the pope, but was phased out centuries ago. You may recall that in pre-"popemobile" days, the pope was often carried around on a portable throne called a *sedes gestatoria*. Since he didn't do much walking, the need for a crozier was minimal. Pope Paul VI introduced the innovation of a walking staff in the 1960s, and everyone remembers Pope John Paul II's walking staff, not a crook, but a delicately sculptured crucifix. Thus, the pope carries a "pastoral staff" rather than a crozier. Precisely because the pope's ministry is universal, to the whole world, popes will likely leave croziers in the hands of the bishops they commission for care of specific flocks. —Rev. 
