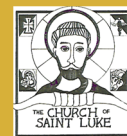

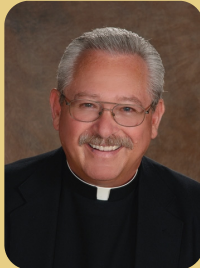

From the Pastor



Dear parishioners,

I'm back from our Rhine River Cruise trip. It was a good trip and I believe every person who went feels the same way. People ask what town or site was my favorite and I have to say that it was visiting St. Thomas Church in Strasbourg, Germany. As we approached it and I realized what it was I began to get excited and couldn't wait to go in. Our guide said it often was not open but it was that day.

Here is what Wikipedia has to say about it:

The site on which the current church stands was used as a place of worship under the patronage of *Thomas the Apostle* as early as the sixth century. In the ninth century, Bishop *Adelochus* established a magnificent church with adjoining school, however both burned down in 1007, and again in 1144. In 1196, construction began on the façade of a new, fortress-like building with an imposing steeple, built in the *Roman* style. Interrupted several times, the building work was completed in 1521, in the style of the late *Gothic*.

In 1524, the church converted to the Protestant faith (*Martin Bucer* served there as a *Pastor*), a status which it maintained despite annexation of Alsace to the Catholic France. It still administers the primary and secondary schools *École Saint-Thomas* and *Foyer Jean Sturm*, as well as the *Séminaire Protestant*, a seminary located in the adjacent *Baroque* building.

Pretty cool, huh? Yeah, but that is not why I liked it; this is the church where Albert Schweitzer served as a priest and played the organ before becoming a doctor and serving in Africa. This is where he wrote *The Quest of the Historical Jesus* which was my introduction to him in High School or shortly thereafter. He tried to understand what the Church was like right after Jesus's death and studied and wrote about the theology of St. Paul. He focused on the working of the Holy Spirit in the individual and in the Church.

The more I learned about Albert, the more I respected him. Did you know that his family, while he was growing up, worshiped in a church used by Lutherans and Catholics alike, during the same time period? This gave him an openness to diversity and a commitment to Christian unity. Just being in a place where he ministered and worshiped touched me deeply. I could almost feel his presence and definitely felt how connected we all are.

He was a phenomenal intellect. He contributed greatly to the theological dialogue of his day. He was an extremely accomplished musician and designed one of the two organs in the church of St. Thomas. (The other was played by Mozart, by the way.) And, he lived out his faith actively; he established a hospital in Africa, at his own expense, and directly served in the ministry of healing.

I hope you are as impressed as I am and I pray that all of us can follow our passion and live out our faith as actively as did Albert.

PARISH FINANCES

In order to fulfill our budget, we need to collect an average of \$12,722 in the collection basket each week. Some weeks may be higher and some lower but we need to maintain that average. Additionally, we have budgeted for an average of \$12,802 to be contributed monthly through our Online Giving contribution program. The total amount budgeted through these sources is \$660,095 this year. Our budget includes another \$106,384 expected income from other sources; (Annual Catholic Appeal rebates, Christmas & Easter collections, Sacramental Donations, Interest, One-time gifts & bequests, etc.).

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Sometimes, this "Treasures" column can seem to be a species of crib-notes for Catholic *Jeopardy*. Indeed, you may never know when knowledge of our particular vocabulary may come in handy. Such is the case with papal bulls, which conjure up all sorts of images, but are actually not what you might expect. A bull is a papal letter on a matter of great consequence, such as a decision about a crisis in the Church, the declaration of a doctrine, the summoning of a council, or the canonization of a saint. It has a more solemn intention than a mere letter or even an encyclical, a teaching letter circulated through the whole Church. Its odd name comes from the Latin *bullā*, which is the stamp used to apply a signatorial design to the hot lead, or even molten silver or gold, that seals the decree.

The format for the bull is the name of the pope in Latin, followed by the title "servant of the servants of God," also in Latin, and then the text. The title of the bull is always the first two words of the text. Some famous papal bulls are *Exsurge Domine* (Arise, O Lord), written against Martin Luther's Ninety-five Theses in 1520; *Munificentissimus Deus* (The Most Bountiful God), the promulgation of the dogma of the Assumption in 1950 by Pope Pius XII; or *Humanae Salutis* (Human Salvation), by which Pope John XXIII convened the Second Vatican Council in 1962. —Rev. 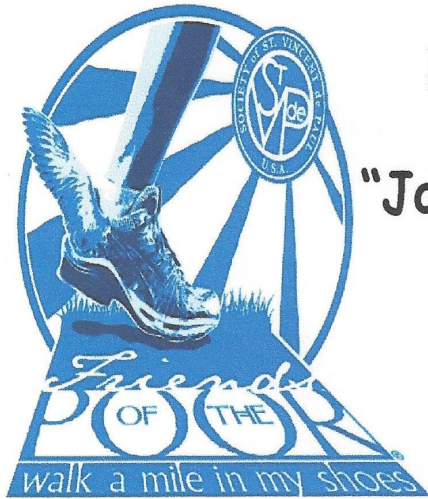
