PARISH FINANCES

In order to fulfill our budget, we need to collect an average of \$12,722 in the collection basket each week. Some weeks may be higher and some lower but we need to maintain that average. Additionally, we have budgeted for an average of \$12,802 to be contributed monthly through our Online Giving contribution program.

The total amount budgeted through these sources is \$660,095 this year. Our budget includes another \$106,384 expected income from other sources; (Annual Catholic Appeal rebates, Christmas & Easter collections, Sacramental Donations, Interest, One-time gifts & bequests, etc.).

TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading — Before anything was created, the wisdom of God was brought forth (Proverbs 8:22-31).

Psalms — O Lord, our God, how wonderful your name in all the earth! (Psalm 8).

Second Reading — God's love has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us (Romans 5:1-5).

JOURNEY OF FAITH

We are on a long and eventful journey. Today's readings for Trinity Sunday succinctly cover the depth and breadth of our human travels. The very beginnings of our journey are revealed in the reading from Proverbs. God's plan filled with divine wisdom was born before the earth was made. In today's Gospel, Jesus speaks of his own personal journey. He has come from the Father and will return to the Father. Only then will the Advocate—the Spirit of Truth—take us onward.

This does not diminish the fact that the journey will be hard. The very setting of the Gospel is the night before Jesus died. As Saint Paul writes to the Romans, "[W]e even boast of our afflictions, knowing that affliction produces endurance, and endurance, proven character, & proven character, hope" (Romans 5:3-4).

Ultimately, our human journey is modeled by the Holy Trinity—a family of love among Father, Son, and Spirit that we are all called to emulate. Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Around the turn of the fourth century, Augustine, still fairly fresh from the baptismal waters in Milan, was elected bishop of a tiny city in North Africa, Hippo. He told his people, "While I am frightened by what I am for you, then I am consoled by what I am with you. For you I am a bishop, with you I am a Christian." He had his priorities right, and also knew that everyone coming from the water arises with a ministry, a specific role, in bringing about God's kingdom.

If we were asked to purge English of Greek vocabulary, we would gain an insight into key ministries in our church. Bishop, from the Greek *episkopos*, would become simply "overseer;" priest, from the Greek *presbyter*, would become "elder;" and deacon, from the Greek *diakonos*, would be "servant." Each title stands in relationship to all the baptized, serving the community, helping it to be the Body of Christ. In our deepest tradition, each of these ordained ministries is attuned to help us become our best selves, to hunger and thirst for the coming of God's kingdom. The goal for each one of us is to be able to recognize the presence of Christ in worship and in service. Although only some of us are ordained to ministry, each of us is called to ministry. —Rev. 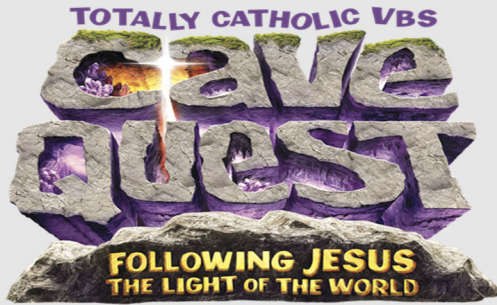
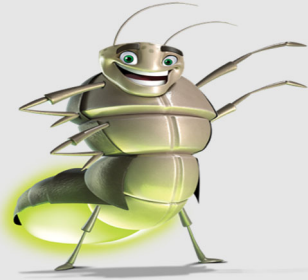
FR. JOE'S VILLAGE IN NEED OF VOLUNTEERS

From the Pastor

Dear parishioners,

This week we want to look at our Adult and Family Faith Formation ministries. The centerpiece of our efforts is the Emmaus Whole Community Intergenerational Faith Formation program. Our program is known throughout the Diocese but we are one of the few parishes that can pull it off. That is because of the talented and dedicated staff we have and the phenomenally capable volunteers who have stepped forward to help. On his pastoral visit, this program was one of the main interests of Bishop McElroy and we have even given a workshop on it at a national convention. In a five-year sequence all the topics recommended by the Church for traditional classroom faith formation are covered in a manner which participants are excited about.

Overall responsibility for the Emmaus program fall upon Jane Alfano who now holds the title of Pastoral Associate. She is also responsible for our traditional Adult Faith Formation offerings like the Diocesan classes for adults which are held at St. Luke, our marriage preparation program, our efforts to establish and maintain Small Ecclesial Communities, and the like. And, she is our staff person for the Parish Pastoral Council and assists me with special projects like the fundraisers we are planning and the Bridges Out of Poverty Initiative I wrote about a few months back.

Here is the work plan for the Faith Formation portion of her duties:

1. **Adult/Whole Community Faith Formation**

Goal: To provide opportunities for the adults and families of our community to be well formed in the faith recognizing that parents are the first and best transmitters of the faith to their children and lay adults are the front line workers in the evangelization mission of the Church.

a) *Intergenerational program: Emmaus (continuation)*

- (1) Goal = Provide a centerpiece for our program to help us live as a community of disciples within the Catholic tradition; learning the faith, living the faith & spreading the faith.
- (2) 2 ½ hr. program for all ages, once/month for 8 months (Oct-May)
- (3) Consists of:
 - (a) *A shared meal with table activities*
 - (b) *An opening song & prayer*
 - (c) *A large group learning experience designed to be fun and educational for all age groups*
 - (d) *Break-out sessions for more in-depth learning in age-appropriate groups (these are discussed in Pre-K through 5th and Youth and Young Adult sections of this work plan.)*
 - (e) *Large group sharing by participants in the activities of the break-out sessions.*
 - (f) *A closing prayer and song*
- (4) Includes take-home resources to continue the learning in the family home setting.
- (5) Utilizes RCIA model of Prayer, Faith Sharing, Catechesis & Christian Service.
- (6) Provides learning opportunities which are less classroom-like & more Church-like while addressing all topics required by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops.

(7) Models life-long faith formation to our youth and counters graduation mentality.

b) College Level Classes (Continuation)

(1) Goal = Provide College level learning opportunities for those interested

(2) Programs scheduled in the Fall, Spring & Summer (6-8 week courses)

c) Arise Small Group Experience

(1) 6-week small group faith sharing experience offered in Fall and Lent.

(2) Goal = help individuals name and claim their experience of the Lord's presence and work in their lives.

d) Bible Study groups (Continuation although not offered every year.)

(1) Deepen individuals' understanding of and appreciation for God's Word as it relates to their day-to-day lives.

(2) Offer an evening and/or daytime study opportunity.
