## REFLECTION ON TODAY'S GOSPEL

*As the day was drawing to a close, the Twelve approached him and said, "Dismiss the crowd so that they can go to the surrounding villages and farms and find lodging and provisions; for we are in a deserted place here." He said to them, "Give them some food yourselves." Lk 9:12-13a*

Reflection: Reflect upon/Share about a time when you saw someone in need and left them on their own to deal with it. Why did you choose not to help them? What would have happened if you had helped fulfill their need? Would you handle the situation differently today, after hearing this week's Gospel?

Alternative: How have you helped someone, in the past? Tell about why you thought they could use your help and how you helped them? How did you feel about it? How do you think they felt? How do you think Jesus felt about it?

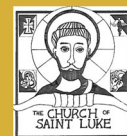

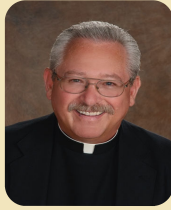

## From the Pastor



Dear parishioners,

I hesitate to wish anyone a happy Memorial Day... It's a day that we take off from school and work because it has been observed as a national holiday since 1971; we can be happy about that. It also unofficially marks the beginning of summer. I like summer. I'm happy about that. But, it's, more importantly, a day that we remember those who died in wars.

From its inception people decorated the graves of those lost in action and originally it was called decoration day. The first observances of this holiday were after the Civil War. Some states honored the dead from both sides while others initially, at least, had difficulty honoring those who had been their enemies. I imagine that was a difficult situation, especially for families who had some members fighting on Union side and others fighting on the Confederate side.

War brings pain and suffering to both sides. At some time in the past, according to the history I was taught, at least, war brought glory to the victors. We honor our military men and women for bravery, as rightly we should, but I don't think that anyone believes there is glory in war anymore. My dad was proud of having served in WW II and he told a lot of war stories but none of them about glory. I'm a Vietnam veteran and lifetime member of the VFW, where I used to regularly spend time, but I don't remember any glory stories there either.

War is horrible. I wish there were another way to solve conflict. The manual from which I learned the Formal Consensus Method of decision making has a quote, "Peace is not the absence of conflict. It is the non-violent resolution of conflict." I think that, to be successful, we need to acknowledge a conflictual situation early on and begin resolving it peacefully long before it produces the hatred which leads to war.

I don't feel powerful enough to bring peace to our world. And, by personality, I'm not that good at resolving conflict peacefully in my personal life. I have the tendency to go on the offensive when I feel like I need to defend myself and sometimes I still use what should be considered violent language in that offensive. I try not to do it but sometimes the best I can do is try to keep quiet with my violent thoughts raging in my head.

I've been working on that... asking the Lord to redeem that part of me which lashes out and I try to pay attention so that I can act fruitfully before my offensive-defense mode takes over. That's what I can do to bring peace to my life and to those with whom I interact. That's how I choose to honor the war dead, by trying to be a peace builder in my personal life and praying that it will spread to others.

Have a safe Memorial day, honor those who have lost their lives in war and pray for peace.

### PARISH FINANCES

In order to fulfill our budget, we need to collect an average of \$12,722 in the collection basket each week. Some weeks may be higher and some lower but we need to maintain that average. Additionally, we have budgeted for an average of \$12,802 to be contributed monthly through our Online Giving contribution program.

The total amount budgeted through these sources is \$660,095 this year. Our budget includes another \$106,384 expected income from other sources; (Annual Catholic Appeal rebates, Christmas & Easter collections, Sacramental Donations, Interest, One-time gifts & bequests, etc.).

## FED BY THE LORD

Jesus' words "This is my body" and "This cup is the new covenant in my blood" were only part of his table blessing. Jesus twice said: "Do this in remembrance of me" (1 Corinthians 11:24, 25).

This is the good news of today's solemnity. Like the five thousand hungry souls, we are fed by our Lord. This is not food that satisfies for only a short time, until the next meal. It is food that lasts and changes us. It is food for sharing in much the same way as Melchizedek did when he brought bread and wine to the returning Abraham.

As children of God's reign, we are blessed to be able to receive and share God's gift. And we do so in the way most appropriate to our state in life—as parents, children, husbands, wives, or religious.

## TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Once the early Christians realized that Christ's coming in glory was delayed, there was a need to provide for the governance and everyday needs of the church. The various "orders" within the church carried forward the apostles' ministry, but also allowed for a measure of creativity. The sacrament we call "holy orders" evolved somewhat slowly. At first, it made sense for Christians to use the forms they knew, adapting them to new situations. Synagogues, for example, were administered by a board of "elders," translated into Greek as *presbyteros*. We know from the Acts of the Apostles that a system of presbyters was a normal feature of church life from earliest days. They stood in relationship to another order, that of "overseers," translated into Greek as *episkopos*, giving us the English "bishops." The bishop was the shepherd, the faithful tender of the flock, one who offered the Eucharist, forgave sins, and maintained the bond of charity. Just as the deacons were the chief advisers for the charitable life of the church, so were the presbyters meant to advise the bishop on the spiritual life of the faithful. They were trusted advisers at first, not pastors or priests as we
