REFLECTION ON TODAY'S GOSPEL

Soon afterward he journeyed to a city called Nain, and his disciples and a large crowd accompanied him. When the Lord saw her, he was moved with pity for her and said to her, "Do not weep." Lk 7:11-13

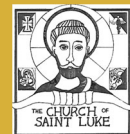

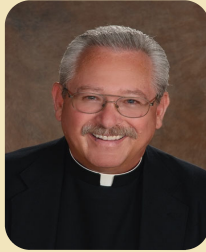

From the Pastor



Dear Parishioners,

I want to thank you for your generosity in our Mission Co-op collection last Sunday. We raised \$4,000 which will be greatly appreciated by the Salesian fathers in Tijuana.

When I went to Desayunador on Tuesday, I was informed that one of our volunteer workers had died. He was struck by a car on Friday and died from his injuries. I've already missed him. He was the worst singer that we had but would always sing loudly as if he had a beautiful voice. During Mass on Tuesday, there was a setting for the Gloria that people weren't used to so they sang quietly; I could hear his voice leading us although he wasn't physically there. I felt his presence anyway.

Kike (kee-kay, a nickname for Enrique) had a very simple but a very strong faith. I don't know from where his faith came but it was very strong. He lived in a bad situation when he was a child and left home when he was twelve. He has been on his own ever since; he was probably in his mid-forties. I guess that it was through his sufferings that he found the Lord.

I think he told me he shared an apartment with some other men. I'm not sure. I know he was poor, only a step above living on the street. Yet, he was a happy man. He was fulfilled. He had friends, all of us and others outside of the Desayunador family. He worked at unskilled and low paying jobs whenever he could find them. He was always proud when he had to leave Desayunador early to go to work.

His life was as simple as his faith. He had very little of the goods of this world but was always thankful to God for what he had. He believed in giving back and reached inside himself to the real riches God gave him so he could give to others. I think that was the reason he was always so happy. Somehow, even though he grew up in circumstance that would have caused others to despair, he discovered faith and lived it out in service to others.

Kike was asked, by another priest, to not sing at Mass because of his poor abilities. For me, I'll always hear him singing. His life was a song and it was beautiful.

PARISH FINANCES

In order to fulfill our budget, we need to collect an average of \$12,722 in the collection basket each week. Some weeks may be higher and some lower but we need to maintain that average. Additionally, we have budgeted for an average of \$12,802 to be contributed monthly through our Online Giving contribution program.

The total amount budgeted through these sources is \$660,095 this year. Our budget includes another \$106,384 expected income from other sources; (Annual Catholic Appeal rebates, Christmas & Easter collections, Sacramental Donations, Interest, One-time gifts & bequests, etc.).

TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading — Elijah revives the son of a widow (1 Kings 17:17-24).

Psalm — I will praise you, Lord, for you have rescued me (Psalm 30).

Second Reading — Paul explains God's call to him to preach to the Gentiles (Galatians 1:11-19).

Gospel — Jesus raises from the dead the son of a widow in the city of Nain (Luke 7:11-17).

HOPE AND LIFE

Today's readings tell the story of two widows. The first reading relates the plight of the widow with whom the prophet Elijah stayed; the Gospel tells about the widow of Nain. In each story, the widow's only son had died. For people who lived in those cultures, the son was the only support of a widow, and the carrying on of the family name by the son was equal to immortality. A widow whose only son has died could lose all hope.

Elijah and Jesus are the restorers of hope; they bring the sons back to life. Saint Paul was metaphorically raised from the dead when he experienced the conversion and call from God that he describes in today's second reading.

What are Christians called to do today? We may not be able to raise the dead, but perhaps we can rekindle hope for a single parent. We may not be able to convert a persecutor like Paul, but if we speak the gospel openly and gently with our lives, we might touch a life with the Good News. Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Unless Professor Einstein's theory of relativity can be translated into any useful kind of time-travel, most of our clues about life in the early church will have to come from ancient letters and ancient prayer texts. A prayer text from a dusty library may yield, for example, an understanding of what "presbyters" actually did. We have such a prayer from the early third century from the hand of Hippolytus of Rome. While our modern prayers derive a great deal from his, some of the practices of the ancient church have fallen away. In his day, bishops were chosen by the people, and the other bishops merely consented. Presbyters, by contrast, seem to have been chosen by the bishops. This makes sense, since it allowed the bishops to hand-pick their most trusted advisers.

It seems that bishops were at first reluctant to share their presiding at the Eucharist with presbyters. In fact, by the time of the fourth-century church's growth spurt in Rome, the bishop sent deacons out with fragments of the host from his Eucharist to drop into the chalices of the presbyters at the outlying eucharistic celebrations. We still have a vestige of this *fermentum* in the Mass today, a reminder of the early bishops' desire to give a powerful sign of the unity of all celebrations of the Eucharist with their ministry, and a clue to their reluctance to delegate a sacramental ministry to the presbyters. —Rev.
