REFLECTION ON TODAY'S GOSPEL

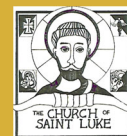

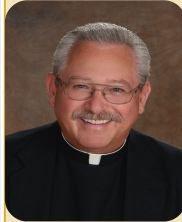

From the Pastor



Dear Parishioners,

I'm really pleased by the general response to our request for parishioners to turn in financial commitment cards by June 19th. By that date we had received two-hundred and fifteen commitments. Some people committed to increased contributions, some to continuing the same amount, some to beginning using envelopes and some to using our automatic e-giving solution. All-in-all, it looks like we will be able to create a balanced budget for this coming fiscal year. I am overjoyed at the number of people who have already committed to helping us continue being the parish we have become and growing from there.

Still, I think we need greater participation. We had set our goal at receiving four-hundred commitments but that number was hard to settle upon. We have over one thousand families registered but only two-hundred and sixty, or so, participate at Mass on any giving weekend. The number of engaged families must be somewhere between those two numbers. We send out six-hundred fifty emails each week but there is no way of knowing how many of those families are really engaged. Four-hundred seemed a good guestimate.

We are going to try to increase the number of families who make a written commitment. And, we want to make this a regular part of what we do each year so that we will have accurate information upon which to base our budget.

In the past, I've avoided talking about money, accept when necessary, because I don't want us to feel that that is what the Church is about. It is not about money and it is not about perpetuating the institution. It is about the mission for which Christ established the Church. The three areas upon which I focus are 1.) growth in holiness of individuals and the community of disciples, 2.) making disciples through our religious education efforts, and 3.) showing God's love for our brothers and sisters through our outreach efforts. The problem is that it requires facilities and an organization with staff and volunteers to accomplish this.

This is what we are asking people to commit to. I don't think the financial amount of a person's commitment matters as long as we are doing our best. It does matter that we commit though. If we don't make a commitment to supporting the mission for which Christ established the Church, it is too easy for us to simply not support it.

We know that some of our younger families don't show a record of regular contributions. Some say it is because they were never taught to give. I think that some families with children in faith formation must think that paying their registration is their contribution without realizing that registrations only pay for a small part of the cost of our faith formation programs. I also think some young families struggle with less disposable income and therefor may not contribute regularly. No matter what your situation, though, I encourage you to make a financial commitment to supporting the mission for which Christ established the Church, no matter how small. The mission of the Church deserves that.

PARISH FINANCES

In order to fulfill our budget, we need to collect an average of \$12,722 in the collection basket each week. Some weeks may be higher and some lower but we need to maintain that average. Additionally, we have budgeted for an average of \$12,802 to be contributed monthly through our Online Giving contribution program.

The total amount budgeted through these sources is \$660,095 this year. Our budget includes another \$106,384 expected income from other sources; (Annual Catholic Appeal rebates, Christmas & Easter collections, Sacramental Donations, Interest, One-time gifts & bequests, etc.).

TODAY'S READINGS

PEACE

The greeting of peace at Mass adds substance to a message of today's readings: peace is relational. When we greet in peace the person near us at Mass, we share the touch of a handshake or embrace, sincere eye contact, and friendly words.

The scriptures speak of a similar peace. The first reading from Isaiah describes the peace of the holy city, Jerusalem, a place of prosperity and comfort where the "LORD's power shall be known to his servants" (Isaiah 66:14c).

The Christian understanding of peace changes slightly. Paul writes of the "peace and mercy" on all who are created anew. Jesus describes a feeling of peace that will rest on those who accept his disciples and their message.

Peace is both an absence of strife and a personal blessing. May we always and sincerely bring peace to our own lives as we share it with others. Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Some say tomato—and some say tomahto—you know the old song. What do you say when you arrive at church and see a font prepared, a baby in the wings, the paschal candle burning? Well, maybe you will say that "we're having a baptism today," or maybe you say "we are having a christening." The proper term is baptism, since that is the name of the sacrament. But the persistent use of "christening" in our culture, probably from due to the influence of the Episcopal Church, is interesting.

Baptism, an ancient word, is from the Greek meaning to dip or to dunk. Christening is an Old English word that describes perfectly well that more than getting splashed with water, the person being baptized is being "Christ-ed." No matter what you call it, there's always water involved, and then an anointing with chrism—fragrant olive oil consecrated as a sign of Christ's presence—poured upon the brow as we say, "As Christ was anointed Priest, Prophet, and King, so may you live always as a member of his body, sharing everlasting life."

So, in being Christ-ed, you are conformed to his image, your life is expected to be a retelling of his life in miniature and you—even though you may be squirming or sleeping—are commissioned to be a priest, a prophet, a king. This means that you are called to be one who worships, you are called to speak the truth, you are called to shape the world and exercise right judgment. That is the deepest treasure of our tradition, and every time you gather to celebrate a baptism, you renew your vows precisely so that you can be more "Christ-ed." No matter what vocabulary you assign to the liturgy, the key is transformation of the human person in the community of the Body of Christ. —Rev. James Field, Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co
