

FROM: THE PASTOR



Dear Parishioners,

I don't know about you but I always have trouble getting into the spirit of Advent. There is so much going on, exciting things and normal things. I help at Reconciliation services for several neighboring parishes. We had ours last night. I watch our phenomenal volunteers working long hours to make sure that the East County Christmas for Kids celebration will be meaningful for the participating families. I see people taking ornaments from the Giving Tree and discussing what they'll get. Our staff is working themselves to the bone. As always, we have more funerals this time of year than at other times. I always get a cold during this time of year, just like so many of you. Etc.

It just seems like too much. I wish we could do everything more slowly and more deliberately. I know we do this every year but every year I ask myself how do we do this right; how do we as a parish celebrate Advent in such a way that our people can enter into the spirit of the season and really be prepared for the celebration of Christmas? You'd think, after fourteen years of priesthood, I'd have this down pretty well by now... but, I don't. Aside from the business there are other things that get in the way for me. I assume that the things that get in the way for me are the same as the things that get in the way for everyone else... so I'll share. One of the things that gets in the way is that we do this every year. It has become routine and too easy to just do it. But how do we enter into it. Another thing that gets in the way is that we are preparing for something that happened two thousand and some years ago. Granted, we are also preparing for the second coming of Christ but is that going to happen on December 25, 2015?

In my fourteen years I have usually used Advent as a time of preparation for the liturgical celebration of Christmas and by that I mean that I am usually preparing for all the parts and pieces of that celebration, actually it is five celebrations, three on Christmas Eve, one here on Christmas Day and one at La Vida Real. Each one has to run smoothly so I worry about the environment, what bells and whistles will we use, how am I going to ever come up with a fresh homily, how am I going to make those who only come to Mass on Christmas and Easter want to come more often, etc. What happens is that I end up preparing so much for the celebrations I fail to prepare for what we are celebrating.

And what are we celebrating? Are we celebrating the coming of our redeemer two thousand years ago? Yes, but we all know that we are already redeemed and I don't have that feeling of expectant waiting. Are we celebrating the second coming of Christ which the early Christians thought would occur in their lifetime? Yes, but none of us, I think, expect it to happen in our lifetime. How do we make this celebration about our day and time? How can we experience the excitement of waiting for something really cool?

Well, as we get closer to Christmas, we can decide to open ourselves up to a personal relationship with the Lord. I know, some of us already have that. If so, we can open ourselves to a deeper, more intimate, relationship with the Lord. When I was being raised, our Church didn't used to teach about personal relationships with the Lord. For most Catholics, relationship with the Lord used to be mediated by the Church, especially through the sacramental life of the Church, but it wasn't intentionally lived out daily in the world. That was left to priests, nuns and religious brothers. They told us what we needed to do to be good Catholics and that was enough. Not anymore! Now we again, like in the early Church, desire that each person should have a personal relationship with the Lord.

So let us, in The Church of St. Luke, prepare the way for that. This Advent let's try to identify anything which stands in the way of a personal relationship with the Lord. Let's clean house and sweep away the things that compete with our Lord's presence. Let us prepare for what we are celebrating rather than just for the celebration.

❖ PARISH FINANCES ❖

In order to fulfill our budget, we need to collect an average of \$12,722 in the collection basket each week. Some weeks may be higher and some lower but we need to maintain that average. Additionally, we have budgeted for an average of \$12,802 to be contributed monthly through our Online Giving contribution program.

The total amount budgeted through these sources is \$660,095 this year. Our budget includes another \$106,384 expected income from other sources; (Annual Catholic Appeal rebates, Christmas & Easter collections, Sacramental Donations, Interest, One-time gifts & bequests, etc.).

A NEW ORDER

"O, Little Town of Bethlehem." A Philadelphia clergyman named Phillips Brooks penned these popular words back in the mid-1800s, but the prophet Micah could have used them first. Micah knew that from small packages great treasures come. In today's first reading, he knew that from tiny Bethlehem would come the Lord.

The writer in Hebrews explains that Christ came to us to do the will of God by establishing a new order and by becoming our perfect sacrifice. And Luke tells us that Elizabeth and John, the infant in her womb, understand that great and wondrous things are at hand with the coming of the Lord.

This is the Fourth Sunday of Advent. Soon we celebrate anew the fruit of Mary's womb. As we are told in Hebrews, Jesus' new order is being established even today. And as Micah proclaims, his greatness is reaching even now to the ends of the earth.

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TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Many of our most treasured traditions link the liturgy of the church with the hearth of the home. The food on the table at certain feasts and fasts helps to extend the mystery into everyday life. Tonight, for example, many families of Italian heritage, especially those with links to the south of Italy, will settle down to the "Feast of the Seven Fishes," or *La Vigilia*. It is a command performance for the whole family, as the saying goes: *Natale con i tuoi, Pasqua con chi vuoi*, or "Christmas with your family, Easter with whomever you wish." Seven different fish, some say one for each day of Mary and Joseph's journey to Bethlehem, others say one for each sacrament, or one for each day of creation, are served. Eel and shrimp, lobster and crab, calamari, pasta with clam sauce, flounder and hake all abound, but most especially baccala, dried salted cod. Why? Many say that it is a way to pay homage to the beasts of the stable who witnessed the holy birth and relinquished their manger to make way for God. Tonight, if someone asks you to "pass the shrimp," you'll be able to shed a little light on a menu that is a delicious treasure in our tradition! —Rev. James Field, Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.


