



FROM: THE PASTOR



Dear parishioners,

Last week when I was volunteering at the Desayunador (the breakfast hall) there was a man who stayed at his table after his table mates had left. He just sat there crying.

I went over to talk to him and he told me that he was missing his wife and six children in Los Angeles. When he realized that I don't really speak Spanish, he switched over to English and I was surprised that his English is every bit as good as mine. I later found out that he was brought to the U.S. by his parents when he was eleven. He said he doesn't even know anything about Mexico. Like many, he simply stayed and built a life with an American wife and children who are citizens because of their place of birth.

He had gotten deported from the U.S. I didn't ask him why. I assumed that he was under the ten-year bar from re-applying for entry but he seemed to think he would never be able to return. He looked to me to be in his early fifties. I put my hands on his shoulders and we prayed together for a while. Then I went back to work.

One of the ladies who helps run the place came over to me and remarked that I have a big heart. That's when I started to cry. I know that some will think of me as just a bleeding heart liberal but I can't help see the human faces imbedded in these situations. I don't mind being a bleeding heart liberal and I don't mind trying to be the face of God's love for people who are suffering, no matter why they are suffering, no matter what they did, no matter how legal or illegal they are. I agree with Pope Francis; we need to be the face of God's mercy for His people.

Later that afternoon I was talking with a dual citizen Mexican-American lady who is retired and lives down there most of the time. I told her about the man and her response was "why don't they just become citizens". After all, that's what she did somehow and that's what she knows.

Many people have tried that; to do it the right way. They came back to Mexico after living undocumented in the U.S. to apply for a Visa, as is required, and begin the process of acquiring citizenship. Then they find out about the automatic bar from re-entry, three years if they have been in the U.S. illegally for six months and less than a year, ten years if more than a year. These punitive measures were passed into law in the U.S. in 1996. It was thought that they would make people think twice before coming here illegally. What it did in the case of the gentleman with whom I was talking, and with many more, was to create a single-parent, female headed household with several kids. Statistics indicate that this will increase costs to our society.

Our understanding of immigration from Mexico as a problem and discussion of appropriate ways to handle it is hugely complex and confusing. We seem to have a general attitude that they are responsible for many of our problems and therefore simply don't want them here. And, the Obama administration has done a lot about that. They have deported at a higher rate than any other time in our history. The San Diego County Department of Agriculture states, on National Public Radio, that we have so few field workers now that farm owners are choosing not to plant labor intensive crops; they say we will become more and more dependent upon imported produce because of the prevailing attitude toward immigration.

I don't know the solution but I know there are human faces embedded in the problem. I've heard the story I'm relating today, face-to-face, many, many times. That's why I volunteer at Desayunador; someone needs to let people know that we see them as God's children too and we are capable of caring about them.

❖ PARISH FINANCES ❖

In order to fulfill our budget, we need to collect an average of \$12,722 in the collection basket each week. Some weeks may be higher and some lower but we need to maintain that average. Additionally, we have budgeted for an average of \$12,802 to be contributed monthly through our Online Giving contribution program.

The total amount budgeted through these sources is \$660,095 this year. Our budget includes another \$106,384 expected income from other sources; (Annual Catholic Appeal rebates, Christmas & Easter collections, Sacramental Donations, Interest, One-time gifts & bequests, etc.).

MANIFESTING THE SPIRIT

The Christmas season closes this Sunday with the Baptism of the Lord. This feast is a sister to last week's feast of the Epiphany. Each of them celebrates an "epiphany," or a manifestation of the Spirit of God in Jesus—first in his birth, and now at his baptism.

The divine Spirit is manifested in all of the scriptures for this feast. Psalm 104 highlights the Spirit of God creating and renewing the earth, while the reading from Isaiah describes God restoring Israel. In Luke's account of the baptism of the Lord the Holy Spirit descends upon Jesus. And the letter to Titus reminds us that the Holy Spirit was "richly poured out" on us also, through the "bath of rebirth" (Titus 3:5, 6). Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Merry Christmas! Share that cheerful greeting with some folks today. They may wonder if you have had any Elvis sightings lately, attended Star Trek conventions, or were Cleopatra in a previous lifetime. Despite the skeptics, today is solidly within the Christmas season. In fact, in some strands of the Christian tradition it represents the clearest manifestation of the mystery of the Incarnation. On Christmas Day, for example, the Gospel reading is the Prologue of John's Gospel, which reveals the glory of Christ shining through our humanity precisely in his baptism.

At any rate, this is an ancient feast, celebrated first in Egypt sixteen centuries ago. More than most other ancient people, the Egyptians understood the life-giving properties of water. On this day, they drew water from the Nile, so central in the history of their people, and reserved it in honor. Many other places copied the custom, so that St. John Chrysostom wrote of people in Antioch gathering at midnight to collect flowing water into vessels they brought from home since "today there is a blessing on the water." At home for dinner tonight, decorate the table with beautiful bowls of water and white candles, toast one another with goblets of sparkling water, and light a Christmas candle in the window one last time. —Rev. 
