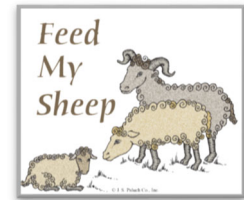

## REFLECTION ON TODAY'S GOSPEL

*Simon Peter said to them, "I am going fishing." They said to him, "We also will come with you." So they went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing. When it was already dawn, Jesus was standing on the shore; but the disciples did not realize that it was Jesus. Jesus said to them, "Children, have you caught anything to eat?" They answered him, "No." So he said to them, "Cast the net over the right side of the boat and you will find something." So they cast it, and were not able to pull it in because of the number of fish.*

**Reflection:** Reflect upon/Share about your experience fishing for "men" (raising your children in the faith, bringing a friend to the faith, etc). Did you work alone or did you invite the Lord to lead you? How fruitful were your efforts? What can you do to ensure that the Lord is leading you as you carry out your part of the mission of the Church?

**Alternative:** Reflect upon/Share about a time when you tried to do something on your own and weren't able to accomplish the task? Who did you, or could you have, asked for help? What types of things do you think the Lord can help you with? What do you need to do to ask for his help?

**FROM: THE PASTOR** Reprint of previous column dated 4/14/2013



Dear Parishioners,

If God created us and blew his breath, or spirit, into our nostrils and we became a living soul (Gen 2:7), why are we so messed up? I mean, God doesn't create messed up things. And, it's his spirit that gives us life... our lives ought to be more perfect. But, we're not. We make all sorts of mistakes. Sometimes we purposefully do selfish or unloving things. Sometimes we even do hateful things.

Probably the most well-known and accepted explanation is the Original Sin story (Gen 3). It works for many people. You know it. The serpent tempted Eve to taste the fruit of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, which God had forbidden. She passed it to Adam, who also tasted it, and it was all downhill from here. God created good, and he can only create good, but we messed it up. We say the result of Original Sin is our propensity to sin. It's a good explanation.

In the second century Irenaeus of Lyon had a different idea. You can find it in his writing *Against Heresies*. He wrote it as a refutation of the Gnostic idea that the body was bad. He postulated that God created us in an immature state. He said that we grow and mature by living life and making choices. By experiencing the benefits of choosing the good and the consequences of bad choices we learn to prefer the good and become the persons God created us to be. The idea kind of makes sense to me. It coincides, in some ways, with my experience of life. Also, I don't think it negates the Adam and Eve story. They obviously made a bad choice.

I think the Gospel according to Matthew agrees with Irenaeus. Remember Matthew 5:48 where it says "So be perfect, just as your heavenly father is perfect." Did you know that the Greek word *teleios* which we translate as perfect can also be translated as complete? It's not because it could mean either thing; it's because it means both things. It is being perfect because you are complete and I mean completed the way God created us to be completed. Doesn't it make sense to say: Be complete as your heavenly father is complete? I think it does but it is not a good choice for the translation because of what goes before it and because our word complete doesn't contain the sense of goodness required to capture the sense of how the word being translated is used in Matthew. Imagine the human being who matured into the person God created them to be. He or she would be perfect.

The trouble is we don't mature to become the person God created us to be. Very saintly people are close but most of us... well you know. We make good choices but we also make wrong choices. Sometimes we try to become the person we think society, or our peer group, wants us to be. Sometimes we decide we want to be a person we think we'll like better than the person we think God created us to be. Sometimes we try to be a person who seems to us would be more fun, or more powerful, or more popular or more whatever than the person God created us to be. Sometimes we want to become God in our lives; isn't that pretty much the temptation with which the serpent tempted Eve? (Gen 3:5)

And so we all deal with the consequences of our wrong choices and hopefully that helps us let go of it and make a choice for the good to replace it. I think that is what the Holy Spirit leads us to, all truth (Jn 16:13), if we cooperate with the Spirit and I think that is what Richard Rohr means when he says we are living out of the redeemed side of our personality trait.

### PARISH FINANCES

In order to fulfill our budget, we need to collect an average of \$12,722 in the collection basket each week. Some weeks may be higher and some lower but we need to maintain that average. Additionally, we have budgeted for an average of \$12,802 to be contributed monthly through our Online Giving contribution program.

The total amount budgeted through these sources is \$660,095 this year. Our budget includes another \$106,384 expected income from other sources; (Annual Catholic Appeal rebates, Christmas & Easter collections, Sacramental Donations, Interest, One-time gifts & bequests, etc.).

## REDEMPTION

Do you remember Peter on the night Jesus was arrested? He claimed he had never heard of Jesus. Today we are called to join Peter in testifying to the name of Jesus as he does in the first reading, and in proclaiming our love for him as Peter does in the Gospel passage. The powerful imagery of John's vision in the second reading from the book of Revelation shows us the company we keep when we have faith in the name of Jesus. We join all living creatures, "countless in number" from "heaven, earth, under the earth, in the sea; everything in the universe" (Revelation 5:11, 13). The dignity and majesty described in each reading are in stark contrast to the dark and pitiful image of Peter and the other apostles at the time of Jesus' arrest, trial, and crucifixion. ## TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

From the earliest centuries, we know that some Christian women desired to vow themselves to a celibate life to pray and serve. Some, but by no means everyone, wanted a kind of monastic life. Others wanted to stay in the family home. By the fourth century, the church was celebrating the "Consecration of Virgins," a rite performed by the bishop, and involving a "veiling" of the woman. It was looked upon as a form of marriage with Christ, partly because in the culture of the day a woman's status in society was linked to a man. The prayers and ritual for the consecration of virgins were exactly the same as the prayers and ritual for the consecration of a bride on her wedding day. The public character of the rite gave the bishop the opportunity to commend the virgin to the faithful, and to threaten with punishment anyone who tried to turn her from her commitment. Eventually, the rite fell into disuse for women living in the world, and was reserved for nuns. The Second Vatican Council directed that it be revived and restored, and in nearly every diocese, single women have embraced this form of consecrated life. —Rev. James Field, Copyright © J. S.

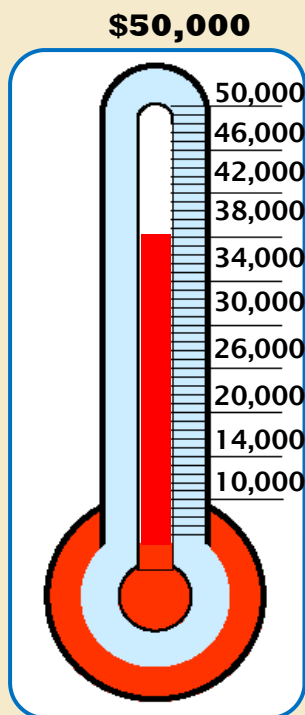

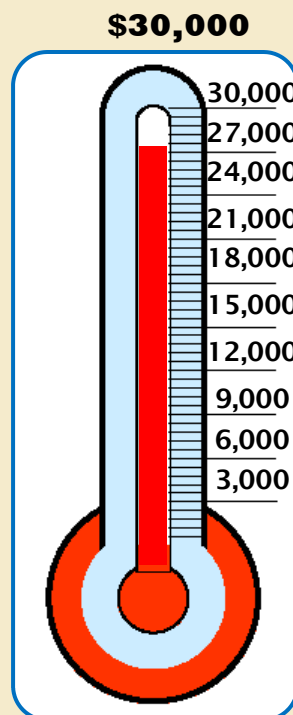
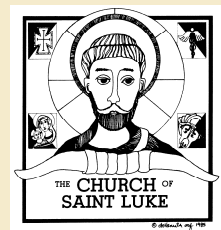
