REFLECTION ON TODAY’S GOSPEL

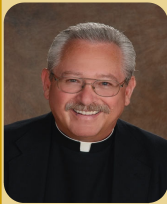

FROM: THE PASTOR



Dear Parishioners,
Quite a while back, before I went to the seminary and was ordained, I used to teach faith formation as a volunteer. I did this in a couple of different parishes and both used to have me teach 8th & 9th graders. For some reason they thought I could handle them. Well, I can't but I learned a lot in the process. One thing I learned was that they didn't know the stories of our tradition. They didn't know even the basic Bible stories.

Since ordination I've tried a couple of different ways to teach kids Bible stories so they would know them by the time they reached Middle School. You see, the stories of our tradition are just stories to young kids but sometime around Middle School they are starting to ask real life questions and just stories aren't good enough. Our stories aren't just stories, they speak to life, as you all know. But if you don't even know the stories you never discover that. If you do know the stories by the time you begin asking deeper questions, then Scripture explodes with meaning and you discover that it is not just a bunch of stories about some things that happened a long time ago but are stories about the life you are discovering.

I want our youth to discover that and I want Scripture and the Church to be meaningful in their relationship with the Lord. I want their relationship with the Lord to be meaningful in their lives. I think we are on the right track at St. Luke and I think our experience at the 9:00 am Mass this last weekend demonstrates it.

We celebrated First Communion with Allison Ruiz and her family. I preached and as I usually do, I had questions for Allison. I usually have questions for the kids and sometimes the homily seems to require questions that above what the kids can usually deal with. Even when I give them the answers beforehand it can be a little difficult because they are hard for the young people to remember. This week that wasn't a problem because the Gospel lent itself to dealing with several different Scripture stories and Allison knew most of the stories.

I asked her, first, about the Story that occurs in the Gospel immediately before the selection we had this weekend. That was the story of the Good Shepherd and yep... she knew it. She also knew the story about the Multiplication of the Loaves and pretty much whatever else I asked her. When I asked her how she knew these stories she said, matter-of-factly and with a smile, from the classes she goes to on Wednesday afternoon. Those classes are what we call Catechesis of the Good Shepherd. And yes, all the kids learn the stories and they seem to enjoy learning them.

That's not all they learn though. They learn about the Mass and several parents have told me that their children know more about the Mass than they do. They also learn to pray, by praying together during each session. No they are not just learning their prayers - that's a parent job anyway. They are learning to pray, to have a prayer filled relationship with the Lord. That is the beauty of Catechesis of the Good Shepherd; It helps them develop a relationship with the Lord through Scripture, through the Mass and through a vibrant prayer life.

Allison also participates in our Emmaus program every month. At her age it is oriented toward helping the family have a relationship with the Lord within the Church as a family. I think it is working too. We have a lot to be thankful for here at St. Luke.

PARISH FINANCES

In order to fulfill our budget, we need to collect an average of \$12,722 in the collection basket each week. Some weeks may be higher and some lower but we need to maintain that average. Additionally, we have budgeted for an average of \$12,802 to be contributed monthly through our Online Giving contribution program.

The total amount budgeted through these sources is \$660,095 this year. Our budget includes another \$106,384 expected income from other sources; (Annual Catholic Appeal rebates, Christmas & Easter collections, Sacramental Donations, Interest, One-time gifts & bequests, etc.).

TRUE CHRISTIAN COMMUNITY

Can you imagine a world such as the one put before us in today's scripture readings? TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The French Revolution swept the church in France away in an astonishing way, stripping the nation of every possible vestige of the faith, not merely shuttering churches, but using them as staging areas for pagan raves and romps. While millions of faithful simply went underground and hung on for the ride, even the seven-day week was demolished along with the names of the months. What emerged from the chaos was the Napoleonic Code of 1792 governing church life, and therefore marriage law in France, French Canada, and elsewhere. The code makes civil marriage mandatory for all citizens.

In practice, when the faithful marry, they go first to the City Hall. There, the mayor performs the civil marriage, usually accompanied by a patriotic speech about the duties of the citizen, particularly in the rearing of children. Then, typically after a lunch, everyone goes off to change into more festive attire for the wedding liturgy, featuring consent, the exchange of rings, and the nuptial blessing. Sadly, only a minority of citizens today celebrate even the civil form of the rite, and a fraction of those continue on to the church. For those who do celebrate the liturgy of marriage, however, there is near certainty that the spouses are active worshipers, and that they will later present their children for baptism. —Rev.
