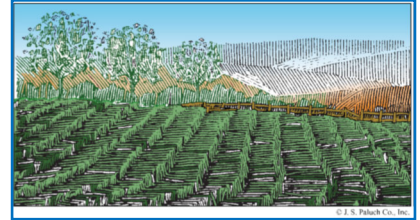

REFLECTION ON TODAY'S GOSPEL

As they were proceeding on their journey someone said to him, "I will follow you wherever you go." Jesus answered him, "Foxes have dens and birds of the sky have nests, but the Son of Man has nowhere to rest his head." And to another he said, "Follow me." But he replied "(Lord,) let me go first and bury my father." But he answered him, "Let the dead bury their dead. But you, go and proclaim the kingdom of God." And another said, "I will follow you, Lord, but first let me say farewell to my family at home." (To him) Jesus said, "No one who sets a hand to the plow and looks to what was left behind is fit for the kingdom of God." Lk 9:57-62

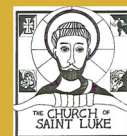

From the Pastor



Dear Parishioners,
Several weeks ago, now, two of my friends in Rosarito lost their business to fire. They sold carpets and mattresses in a fenced-in area in front of Angie's house. She is a single mom with two kids, one still a minor. She is courageous and hardworking; doing what she had to do to raise her children. I met them when I bought mattresses from them and we have since become friends.

Trini is her boyfriend. He is one of the deportees from the U.S. who came here when he was a teenager and was deported in his late thirties. He has one of those punitive ten year bans on him to keep him from re-entering. He left a wife here who did not want to wait for him to return; they are now divorced. With his wife he owned a home here and supported them doing roofing work. He had employees and, from what he tells me, treated them very well. He is always proud to say that he paid all his traffic fines while he was here. I'm not quite sure what that was about but I think he is saying he tried hard to be a good resident of this country, legal or not.

The fire was started outside Angie's home around 2:00 o'clock in the morning. She got her kids out but, by the time they got out, the building was already engulfed. There was a spectacular video on one of the local websites and, from watching it, I'd say they were lucky to get out. When I asked about insurance, I was told "this is Mexico...". Poor people in Mexico rarely have home insurance and oftentimes keep their money hidden somewhere in the house. That's exactly what happened to them; the house is gone, the business is gone, the inventory is gone and the money is gone. I was overwhelmed by the sight when I went down that weekend and took pictures with my cellphone.

Yesterday, I took pictures again as they began the process of rebuilding. I know... you're thinking "How could they rebuild? I thought everything, including the money was gone and there was no insurance!" Yes, that's true and that is why I'm writing this column. Friends and acquaintances have pitched in to help them get the necessary supplies to rebuild... Wow!

This is a story about "what goes around, comes around" in a good sense. It is what the Indians call Karma. The Christian concept closest to this is from Lk 6: 38 "Give, and it will be given to you. Good measure, pressed down, shaken together, running over, will be put into your lap. For with the measure you use it will be measured back to you." I don't think this is about giving financially. Although we may use it at times to get people to be generous in the collection, it is really talking about giving of yourself. That is what Trini and Angie do and that is what people have responded too.

I'm amazed by what people have done. I'm excited for Trini and Angie and I'm feeling really good about humanity right now. We have so many troubles in our world. Evil seems to have run out of control in the Middle-East and has spilt over to many other countries. We seem to be politically polarized in our country and it makes me worry if we will ever be able to move ahead as a people. Yet we see phenomenal acts of love out of people when they see others in desperate circumstances. Praise God. His love is visibly at work through people and it gives me hope.

PARISH FINANCES

In order to fulfill our budget, we need to collect an average of \$12,722 in the collection basket each week. Some weeks may be higher and some lower but we need to maintain that average. Additionally, we have budgeted for an average of \$12,802 to be contributed monthly through our Online Giving contribution program.

The total amount budgeted through these sources is \$660,095 this year. Our budget includes another \$106,384 expected income from other sources; (Annual Catholic Appeal rebates, Christmas & Easter collections, Sacramental Donations, Interest, One-time gifts & bequests, etc.).

FOCUS ON THE MISSION

“There are so many things to do.” “We have so little time.” How many variations of these statements have you heard or even said yourself?

Actually neither statement is completely true. There are many things to do in this life, but really few things that are vitally important. Working, searching, conniving, and worrying our way to “gratify[ing] the desires of the flesh,” as Paul relates in today’s second reading, are really non-productive. So little time? When we take on the freedom that Christ offers us, we have all the time we need in this world, and even more in the next.

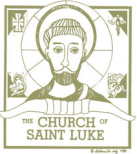

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

An old and still vital treasure in our tradition is a document called the “Apostolic Traditions,” giving us a snapshot of church life in third-century Rome. Its author, Hippolytus, describes the liturgical life of the church and records the actual texts of the prayers. The way he explained the various “orders” of the church was the basis for a major reform of the rites of ordination by Pope Pius XII in 1947, and later for the Second Vatican Council. Hippolytus tells us that a bishop had to be elected by the entire people, and that ordination had to take place on a Sunday in the presence of the people, the presbyters, and neighboring bishops. The bishop-candidate is ordained by the other bishops, who impose their hands on his head while everyone else keeps a profound silence, awaiting the outpouring of the Spirit. There is a prayer of blessing said by one of them, on behalf of all, asking for the Spirit and describing his ministry.

Later centuries layered new features on top of this liturgy, including the requirement for three bishop consecrators. Today, whenever a new bishop is announced (election by the people is no more), a kind of genealogy is provided, tracing his pedigree through the consecrating bishops down through the centuries to Peter and the first body of believers. Every bishop today can trace his office through his consecrators back to the beginning in a tradition called “apostolic succession.” —Rev. James Field, Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.





We are at a crossroads here at St. Luke. Due to increased expenses and the death or moving away of major contributors, we are showing a deficit in our proposed 2016-2017 budget in excess of \$40,000. We cannot begin a new fiscal year with this kind of deficit.

*We are asking that every family, new and old, complete the
Commitment Card below and return it by June 19th.*

As you determine prayerfully to what extent your family should be supporting the mission of the Church, I recommend you use the biblical concept of tithing as your guide. Whatever percentage of your income you decide to give, remember:

1. Give from the first fruits of the gifts God has given you, off the top before other decisions are made. Consider using one of our online Automatic Deduction/Credit program to insure it always come off the top.
2. Give as an act of thanksgiving to God for His graciousness to you. Let the amount you contribute be a symbol of the level of your thankfulness.
3.
