REFLECTION ON TODAY'S GOSPEL

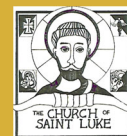

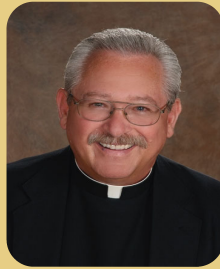

From the Pastor



Dear Parishioners,

I'm writing on Tuesday; the day I volunteer at Desayunador (the breakfast hall.) in Tijuana. The Gospel at Mass today was the one in which Jesus is reproaching the towns where his mighty deeds were done but they did not repent. I suggested to the volunteers that, if they looked people in the eye and really saw the person they would see Jesus' mighty deeds being done in our midst. I suggested that we miss our Lord's mighty deeds because humans have become so powerful, in this the twenty-first century, that we think we are responsible for everything that happens.

We had lots of young adult volunteers today, Orthodox Christians from all over the U.S. I wasn't needed to do my regular job where I interact with people at the tables. Rather I handed out paper towels in the hand washing line and interacted individually with all 1,000 people we fed. One of the things I noticed was that when I said Buenos días. ¿Como estás? (Good morning. How are you?), many people responded Bien. Gracias a Dios. (Well. Thanks be to God.)

One gentleman with whom I struck up a conversation, ended by saying "God is..." I finished it for him by saying "good" and expecting him to say "all the time". Instead he looked at me and said "God is love!" Of course we were saying the same thing, in a way, but I liked the way he said it. I interpreted it to mean that he is experiencing God's love in his life.

Remember, these are very poor people who don't get enough nourishment and therefore come to Desayunador on a regular basis. Many of them are homeless and live on the street. Yet they are able to experience, and are very aware of, God's love for them. That's what His mighty deeds are. Expressed in many ways, they are the experience of His love.

I think people who have so very little, who have little power in their own lives, can, more readily, recognize and claim the experience of God's love in their lives. We, on the other hand, have much personal power to which we easily attribute the good we experience. Maybe our personal power, itself, is a gift from God.

What that means to me is that I have to be intentional about thanking God for his action in my life, especially for the things He has given me that allow me to do the things I do well. It is not that "I" am so capable, it is that He has given me traits that I sometimes use well, hopefully to the glory of His name. If I develop the pattern of being thankful, I might even recognize his mighty deeds more often.

PARISH FINANCES

In order to fulfill our budget, we need to collect an average of \$12,722 in the collection basket each week. Some weeks may be higher and some lower but we need to maintain that average. Additionally, we have budgeted for an average of \$12,802 to be contributed monthly through our Online Giving contribution program.

The total amount budgeted through these sources is \$660,095 this year. Our budget includes another \$106,384 expected income from other sources; (Annual Catholic Appeal rebates, Christmas & Easter collections, Sacramental Donations, Interest, One-time gifts & bequests, etc.).

WATCH YOUR POSTURE

Our posture is often a tip-off to our hospitality and reverence for the Lord. Note the actions of Abraham as he greeted the Lord in the presence of three men who appeared near his tent. He ran from the entrance of the tent to greet them. He bowed to the ground as he met them. He and Sarah, his wife, hastened to prepare a meal and bring food and water to their guests.

In the Gospel story, Jesus' friend Mary sat at his feet in order to listen to him speak.

How do we welcome and reverence the Lord? What do our actions show? Do we remember the Lord's presence in the Blessed Sacrament? How do we welcome the Lord in the scripture readings? How do we acknowledge his presence in our brothers and sisters, both at Mass and afterwards?

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The French Revolution is hardly a "treasure" in our story, yet in 1789 it began to dismantle the way the world was organized: feudalism. The collapsed society had three basic divisions: those who work, those who fight, and those who pray. There wasn't a great deal of movement among the ranks, yet one way to move out of the workers and the fighters was in the direction of the folks who prayed. These were the First Estate, the clergy.

One of the key persons in any manor or village was the priest. He could read, at least a bit, and so was the source for pronouncements and news from government and Church. He was assigned to celebrate the sacraments frequently and in conformance with certain rules.

Seminaries did not exist before the Reformation. Astute Protestant reformers then forced the Catholic world toward a more educated and able clergy. Before that, young men apprenticed with a priest to learn the essentials, and would be presented to the bishop for ordination. Other priests emerged from the university system, where students were required to be invested as clerics. Still others were monks, ordained not so much for ministry outside the monastic walls, but to offer Mass only for the intentions of the community's benefactors. —Rev. James Field, Copyright © J. S. 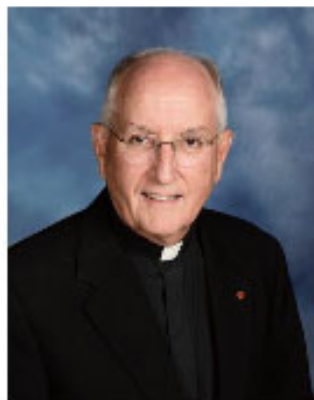

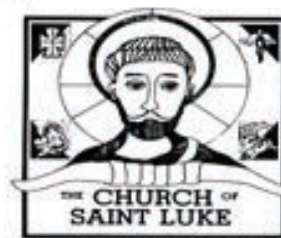
