
### REFLECTION ON TODAY'S GOSPEL





## **From the Pastor**



Dear parishioners,

I'm now finished with my modified sabbatical. If you are not aware, I took six weeks off interrupted by one week of Convocation (making it seven weeks total) with the other priests of the Diocese and our bishop. In order to accomplish this without costing the parish money, I was only gone from Monday through Friday so it wasn't a full sabbatical. My goal was to improve my Spanish language skills, to reflect on my ministry as pastor and to reflect upon an appropriate spirituality for active people with the intent of deepening my own spirituality and sharpening my ability to help lay people with their spirituality.

I don't know how fruitful I've been. I've only had two and a half days for reflection, other than the five days of Convocation with the other priests and the bishop. My ability to hear Spanish spoken to me has improved, I must say that. But, my ability to speak and converse is not much better. My vocabulary is so limited. I read Spanish much better than I speak it and I have yet to start thinking in Spanish, a goal that anyone learning a language works toward.

Reflecting upon my role as pastor, which I've done little of, has convinced me that the Church needs to find ways of relieving pastors of administrative responsibilities. This would cost the parishes money because it means that we would have to hire lay people who are capable of taking on the responsibilities of total parish administration and we would have to pay them adequately. I've tried to make inroads, in preparation for the person who will replace me in six and one-half years, by establishing the position of Pastoral Associate in our parish. She has also taken over the responsibilities of Adult & Family Faith Formation; as you can imagine, it's a big job.

Our pastoral associate is already doing a fine job and seems to understand the goals of the position but I think she already feels overwhelmed, at times, by the responsibilities. And, her position is only part of the solution. Pastors should not have financial responsibility for a parish! Our annual financial report is late this year because I write the financial report and I've been on my modified sabbatical which has kept me too busy to devote time to it.

Part of the problem is that I believe the financial report needs to be written from a pastoral perspective. I don't believe that a Business Manager, whose focus is accounting for our income and managing our expenditures, can do that. I also don't think it is appropriate to expect a Finance Council volunteer, whose focus is advising the administration on financial and physical plant matters, can be expected to do that. Only a pastor or parish administrator, who has a pastoral focus, can be expected to accomplish the task.

So what is the solution, I don't know exactly but I think we should look in the direction of parishes run by a pastoral team, none of which, by the way, should be hourly employees. All of them should be exempt and parishes should pay the price of having full-time, salaried, employees at the helm. Pastors should be freed up to focus on parish Eucharistic liturgies, preaching the Gospel, administering the Sacraments, developing the lived spirituality of individuals, families and the community of disciples, etc.

I pray for the day when our Church can move in the direction of taking unnecessary stress off the shoulders of pastors. I don't think many of us sought ordination, by the way, to become administrators.

## ❖ PARISH FINANCES ❖

In order to fulfill our budget, we need to collect an average of \$12,722 in the collection basket each week. Some weeks may be higher and some lower but we need to maintain that average. Additionally, we have budgeted for an average of \$12,802 to be contributed monthly through our Online Giving contribution program. The total amount budgeted through these sources is \$660,095 this year. Our budget includes another \$106,384 expected income from other sources; (Annual Catholic Appeal rebates, Christmas & Easter collections, Sacramental Donations, Interest, One-time gifts & bequests, etc.).

## GOD IS WITH US

## TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The recent "October count" tracking the statistics of participation at Sunday Mass calls to mind the situations of churches where it is difficult or impossible for Catholics to worship freely. This is especially striking in English Catholic history, as freedom of worship was systematically dismantled at the time of the Reformation. It seems that most English people retained deeply Catholic sympathies throughout the period of religious upheaval. Catholics who refused to participate in the public worship of the Church of England were called "recusants," and beginning with the reign of Elizabeth I, they were subject to strict penalties. Recusant literally means "a person refusing to obey a command." Most of those laws were in force until the early 1800s, and Catholics were not entirely emancipated from the duty of Anglican worship until 1829.

Recusants paid heavy fines for not attending the state church. Holding on to Catholic faith was therefore a luxury of the very rich, who maintained private chapels, and sent their daughters and sons to English convents and monastery schools on the continent. Remarkably, the first among all British peers, the Dukes of Norfolk, the hereditary Earls Marshal of England, have never given up their Catholic faith. Many of these wealthy recusant families founded the colony of Maryland, and later many members of the old Catholic families continued on to the Kentucky frontier in search of greater religious freedom. --Rev. 

## *The Way - Stewardship*

In case you were not able to attend Mass 2 weeks ago whereby Stewardship was announced by Fr. Ron and Wayne Suerth at each of the Masses on Oct 18<sup>th</sup> and 9th. We want to reiterate our announcement in this week's bulletin.

Stewardship is a term you will hear repeatedly over the coming weeks, months, and years. Some of you may know the term well, others may have a limited understanding of the term, and others may not relate to it at all.

So why are we discussing Stewardship and why does the Diocese of San Diego feel strongly about stewardship awareness. Almost four years ago the Diocese created a Director of Stewardship and Development position to lead the effort in the parishes, and formed the Parish Stewardship Network, a committee comprised of lay members from various parishes who assist each other in stewardship development. Through this group, local parishes that have had a stewardship program for years are an invaluable resource to parishes like ours that are in the initial stages.

Here is one reason.. A national survey about those that call themselves Catholics in the US show 16% are engaged Catholics, 49% are not engaged and 35% are active but not engaged. The latter are referred to flower Catholics – attend Mass only when flowers are on the altar, Christmas, Easter, Weddings and Funerals.

**Christ called us to be His disciples to carry out His mission through Him. Being a disciple as steward has significant meaning in our lives as Christians.**

We have been blessed with many gifts from God in our lives and we in turn should cultivate these gifts by using our time, talents and treasury for and with others. Remember the three parts, time, talent and treasury. The 3 T's as they are referred to.

To paraphrase: We gratefully receive God's gifts. Use those gifts wisely. Share them with others. Lastly, increase them when returning them to the Lord.

**Stewardship offers a path to becoming a disciple of Christ or a more active disciple.**

The Church of St Luke is blessed in that it offers many ministry opportunities that will be highlighted in the coming weeks and months. These ministries, comprised of St Luke members, are wonderful examples of stewards making meaningful differences in the lives of others.
