#### **FROM: THE PASTOR**



Dear Parishioners,

Our Advent Community Reconciliation service is this week, on Thursday the 10<sup>th</sup>. My theory on the difference between Advent and Lenten reconciliation services is that the Lenten ones should have a penitential feel and the Advent ones should not. The Advent ones, maybe, should be more future oriented, like... this is what I

am going to do to live a more holy life rather than this is what I'm sorry for that I did. In reality, they both have part of both aspects.

This Advent, as we did several years ago, we are taking the theme "Prepare the way". And, for our Reconciliation service, we are suggesting that we all do a spiritual house cleaning as a way of preparing for the Lord. Many of us do our holiday house cleaning as part of our preparation for Christmas; we clean, we decorate, we get everything feeling warm and cozy so that we can welcome our family and friends and experience the best the season has to offer.

So this year, I suggest we ask ourselves "What is the trash and rubble which gets in the way of my being present to the Lord and to His people?" "How can I sweep that out of the way?" I'm sure that we will find that it is the same old sins, faults and failings that we have confessed before; at least that is my experience. Either way, here is a short examination of conscience based on our theme.

- What resentments or grievances are tarnishing my life? How can I begin to let go of them and bring the sparkle back to my life?
- What unhealthy habits do I need to dispose of so that I can put healthier habits in place and reduce the chaos that inhibits my experiencing the fullness of the life I have been given?
- What gifts, skills or talents need to be dusted off and put back into the service of the Kingdom?
- What worldly clutter needs to be set aside to make room for the Lord's presence in my life?
- What do I need to rearrange in my life so that I can show God's love more clearly?

What have I swept under the carpet, in my life, which truly needs to be cleaned out to allow for an authentic celebration of the coming of the baby Jesus?

I pray that this Advent we can more and more see these four weeks as a time of preparation to experience the Lord's presence in our lives more deeply, not just on Christmas day but throughout the rest of our lives. If we can experience the Lord more deeply, we can more readily bring His loving presence to others in our day-to-day activities.

#### CS PARISH FINANCES 80

In order to fulfill our budget, we need to collect an average of \$12,722 in the collection basket each week. Some weeks may be higher and some lower but we need to maintain that average. Additionally, we have budgeted for an average of \$12,802 to be contributed monthly through our Online Giving contribution program.

The total amount budgeted through these sources is \$660,095 this year. Our budget includes another \$106,384 expected income from other sources; (Annual Catholic Appeal rebates, Christmas & Easter collections, Sacramental Donations, Interest, One-time gifts & bequests, etc.).

#### **PUT ON JOY**

Today, Baruch speaks of the splendor that lies ahead for the city of Jerusalem and for all of us, regardless of where home is for us. Throw off strife, he tells us, and put on joy. Like a favorite old sweatshirt, joy fits, and how warm it keeps us, even when the winds blow cold.

Paul knows of this joy as he pens his letter to the Philippians, praying that they may grow in their ability to discern what is righteous and good. And Luke speaks to us of John, who was foretold by Isaiah and who sings a similar song—"Prepare the way of the Lord," for salvation is at hand.

#### TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

By now, trees are beginning to appear in living rooms throughout the parish. To a complete outsider to our culture, it must seem an odd thing indeed. The "roots" of this custom are in liturgical drama: religious plays performed in the churches and town squares of medieval Europe. The favorite theme for this time of year was the "Paradise Play," a dramatic history of the human race from the Garden of Eden to the birth of Jesus in Bethlehem. The language and music varied from place to place, but one feature was always in place: a great tree decorated with apples. As a prop, it provided lots of material for the actors: the temptation, shelter for the manger, and a reminder of the wood of the cross. Soon people began to bring "paradise trees" into their homes, decorating them with gifts and lighted candles.

Many Germans give credit to Martin Luther for transforming the "Paradise Tree" into the evergreen Christmas tree. Walking home on a starry Advent night, he was so awed by the beauty of the night that he hauled a pine tree inside and decorated it with lighted candles. Americans were holdouts. It took until 1856 for the Commonwealth of Massachusetts to decriminalize Christmas decorations, the old Puritan dislikes falling before the waves of Irish and German immigrants with traditions firmly in hand! —Rev. 
#### **Blanket Drive**

With many hands we will be done about noon We need men and women no experience necessary.


