Dear Padre

The other day a call came to me: Sir, are you going to heaven... if so how do you know?

I guess it's like the question "are you saved"? It can be puzzling. To be asked are you absolutely sure you will be with Jesus in heaven...that brings one to the point of "absolutely". From a Catholic point of view this is like asking the question of the state of one's conscience..."Have you committed a serious sin for which you have not repented and received absolution?" But I think often the question is have you turned your life over to Jesus and been baptized? If that was the question then the answer is YES! I do continue to live my life for Jesus, doing as he taught, following his commandments, receiving his mercy and forgiveness through reconciliation.

But, I went on to say that I trust in God's grace to support me until the end of my life, and I trust that the process of salvation will be completed when I'm happy with God in heaven. If one truly believes they are saved just by being baptized and saying they believe in Jesus Christ then I would have to say...I think you may be mistaken. The bible and the Church wasn't given to us if it wasn't important to our salvation. This theology often mentions what is called "backsliding" which means that someone who is saved falls back into sinful ways and so changes his or her relationship with God. Until we die, the process of salvation is not complete. The reason it is not complete is that God created us with the ability to determine our lives through the gift of intelligence and free will.

The process of salvation goes on. One must remain free until one dies. We have to choose over and over again between good and evil, between following his will or not. The process of salvation is just that...a process. Christ came to open the process. By his Dying and Rising the process grants us the opportunity to get in line.

So the jest of my answer was...Yes, I have been saved by God's grace, trusting that God will help me remain faithful, follow his will, not mine, and so be with Him forever in heaven. There should be a healthy fear of our human weakness and the power of evil. We are saved in baptism but we need to continue on the journey, following the Lord all our lives.



Mary's Assumption - Question: Is the Assumption a Holy Day? In the United States and other countries, the bishops have received permission from the Vatican to temporarily waive the requirement for Catholics to attend Mass on certain Holy Days of Obligation, when those Holy Days fall on either Saturday or Monday. Because of this, some Catholics have become confused about whether certain feasts are, in fact, Holy Days of Obligation. This year the Assumption (August 15) is one such Holy Day. So the answer this year is: The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary is a Holy Day of Obligation. However, since it falls on Monday, the obligation to attend Mass is waived. Catholics in the United States are not required to attend Mass but Mass will be celebrated here at Immaculate Conception at 8:10 and at St. Barbara at 9:00 Monday morning. The feast of the Assumption of Mary is a very ancient one. It was initiated in the fifth century and was celebrated at the site in Jerusalem where Mary was believed to have rested as she journeyed from Jerusalem to Bethlehem. At that time, the feast was called Theotokos (which means "God-bearer") and was celebrated on August 15. Later, the feast was celebrated at the basilica where Mary's tomb was venerated. The feast later came to be called the Dormition (Mary's "Falling Asleep"). The Assumption of Mary carries with it some special dynamics. Mary, because of her special union with her divine Son, gives witness to Jesus' complete victory over death. In Jesus, and through Mary, we share in the graces that comes from that triumph. In honor of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we will honor Mary with candles on her altar table. Purchase an unlit candle for \$2.00 and place on the table in front of her statue. The candles will be lit on Monday and burn there throughout the week in her honor.
