#### Can or should we take the Bible as literal?

Not only *can* we take the Bible literally, but we also *must*. This is the only way to determine what God really is trying to communicate to us. When we read any piece of literature, but especially the Bible, there's a sense that we must determine what the author *intended* to communicate. The Bible is basically what God is speaking to us so we must not change his thoughts or his message. Many today will read a verse or passage of Scripture and then give their own definitions to the words, phrases, or paragraphs, ignoring the context and author's (God's) intent. But this is not what God intended, which is why God tells us to correctly handle the "Word of truth".

What does it mean to be taken "literally"? What one says is taken in a literal manner, in the strict sense or word for word, without exaggeration or inaccuracy. So should Jesus' words about the Eucharist be taken literally? Might he just have been using figures of speech? It's true that, yes, Jesus did sometimes use metaphors like when Jesus said, "I am the gate" (Jn 10:7). He didn't mean he was a structure made of wood with hinges and a latch. He was using a metaphor, which requires interpretation and is not to be read in a literal way.

The Bible should be read as a figure of speech. Yes, we believe it is literally true, for example, that Jesus was born to the Virgin Mary, lived and taught in Roman occupied Judea, and that he suffered and died for our sins. And we believe it is a historical fact that he rose from the dead. But the strongest reason we should take the Bible literally is because the Lord Jesus Christ took it literally. Whenever the Lord Jesus quoted from the Old Testament, it was always clear that He believed in its literal interpretation. An example is in the gospels we have been hearing the past couple of weeks where he uses the example of the "bread that came down from heaven" to literally remember that **He is that "living bread"**.
