

across the street to get a haircut," was the reply. "But", asked the priest, "Why didn't you do that before Mass?" "Because", the gentleman replied, "I didn't need one then." The truth of a homily is not the length but the content of the message contained within it. Similarly, the quality of a person should not be judged by his or her lifestyle, profession, residence, or possessions, but by the content of the character. Today, Jesus tells us we are the light of the world; to be light would be a positive characteristic for we know how important light is to us. We have the talents and the gifts to live a life as Jesus has taught us. Doing God's will is simply doing as Jesus himself has taught us...to follow his commandments and live his beatitudes.
