

Dear Padre'

Question: Ordinary Time doesn't sound very important is it or isn't it?

Because the term *ordinary* in English most often means something that's not special or distinctive, many people think that Ordinary Time refers to parts of the calendar of the Catholic Church that are unimportant. Even though the season of Ordinary Time makes

up most of the liturgical calendar year, the fact that Ordinary Time refers to those periods that fall outside of the major liturgical seasons such as Christmas, Easter, Lent, and Advent, it still reinforces something important. Ordinary Time is called "ordinary" not because it is common but simply because the weeks of Ordinary Time are numbered. Thus, the numbered weeks of Ordinary Time in fact represent the ordered life of the Church... the period in which we live our lives neither in feasting (as in the Christmas and Easter seasons) or in more severe penance (as in Advent and Lent), but in watchfulness and expectation of the way Christ has taught us. It speaks the truth of our faith, of what we come to know and believe. Today John proclaims just who Christ is: "Behold the Lamb of God".

Thus for us as Catholics, Ordinary Time is the part of the year in which Christ, the Lamb of God, walks among us and transforms our lives, to teach us his ways.
