

The Blessing of the Throats is a sacramental of the Roman Catholic Church, celebrated on February 3, the Feast Day of Saint Blaise of Sebaste. Saint Blaise was the Bishop of Sebaste in Armenia during the fourth century. Very little is known about his life. According to various accounts he



was a physician before becoming a Bishop. His cult spread throughout the entire Church in the Middle Ages because he was reputed to have miraculously cured a little boy who nearly died because of a fishbone in his throat. From the 8th century he has been invoked on behalf of the sick, especially those afflicted with illnesses of the throat (taken from Wikipedia) On Friday morning, February 3rd, all are invited to attend the 8:00 a.m. Mass at which time the blessing of throats will be offered for anyone who is suffering from illnesses of the throat or any other illnesses or would just like to receive the blessing of the throat.

The Presentation of the Lord will be celebrated on Thursday, February 2nd. At the 8:10 a.m. Mass. The Presentation of Jesus at the Temple is an early episode in the life of Jesus that is celebrated by the Church on the holiday of Candlemas. The Gospel tells us of the story of when Mary and Joseph took the 40 day old Jesus to the temple in Jerusalem to present him to God, in accordance with Jewish law. This story is also the fourth Joyful Mystery of the Rosary. A blessing of the candles will be offered at the beginning of Mass that day. If you would like to have a candle(s) blessed, please bring them that morning and place on the table which will be located in front of St. Joseph.

Dear Padre' **Ouestion:** What are the Beatitudes?

- 5. Blessed are the complainers for their complaints are music to my ears.
- 6. Blessed are those who keep a list of the pastor's mistakes thank goodness...for they get nothing out of his sermons and that makes me happy.
- 7. Blessed are those who are filled with hatred so am I!
- 8. Blessed are those who gossip for they shall cause strife and divisions...and that pleases me a whole lot.
- 9. Blessed are those who are easily offended for they will soon get angry and quit and I say "Keep it up. I'm waiting on you."
- 10. Blessed are those who do not give an offering to carry on God's work for in not giving back to God, you really make me happy...thanks buddy.
