A series of deadly summer storms wreaked havoc in West Virginia, in late June, and in southern Louisiana, in mid-August. Then Hurricane Matthew, a category 4 Hurricane, hit Haiti head-on, barreling through Cuba and Jamaica, before climbing the U.S. Eastern seaboard in October.

Thousands perished. Tens of thousands homes were destroyed in Haiti alone and upwards of half a million were left homeless in the United States from the devastating flash flooding in West Virginia, Louisiana, and North Carolina and the destruction Hurricane Matthew wrought.

Within days of each natural disaster, USCCB President Archbishop Joseph E. Kurtz of Louisville called for emergency collections to support humanitarian relief efforts to impacted areas. With Bishop Daniel E. Thomas' encouragement and support, Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Toledo made appeals through social media and Diocesan parishes, on behalf of Catholic Charities agencies and Catholic Relief Services (CRS).

"We have been overwhelmed by the outpouring of support and generosity," says Rodney Schuster, Executive Director. "As of December 31, 2016, Catholic Charities has processed \$186,709 from donors and the Diocese's special collections for disaster relief. All of these funds, dollar for dollar, have been directed to Catholic Charities agencies and Catholic Relief Services."

Donations are first used for emergency assistance, helping to meet individuals and families immediate needs: providing food, water, temporary shelter, clothing, medicine and medical care, hygiene and cleaning kits, crisis counseling and transportation. Long-term recovery efforts include case management, home damage assessments, housing repair and home rebuilding in all of the affected areas.
