

Dear Padre'...What is the Christmas season? The liturgical season of Christmas begins with the vigil Masses (December 24th. at 4:00) Christmas Eve and concludes on the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. For us as religiously observant Catholics, the Christmas season includes Christmas and the days within the Octave of Christmas (8 days) - they are Christmas and the seven days that follow. The

Christmas Season for the Catholic Church is white or gold, not green and red, as many people assume. During this season, it's a glorious celebration where, for the most part, we celebrate the birth of Christ into our world and into our hearts and we reflect on the gift of salvation that is born with him...including the fact he was born to die for us...as we are baptized within him we, too, die with him. So the Christmas season actually ends after the Epiphany at the Baptism of our Lord (which this year is Monday) January 9th. Often I think we are slowly drawn into the mysteries of the Christmas season. The crib season is an example of doing that, as the figurines are added slowly as they appear with the mystery of Christmas happenings. Yes. Christmas comes and Christmas goes, but he continues to live in our hearts. ~ Padre' Jerry

As we enter into the winter season, Bishop Daniel Thomas has asked that the Diocesan Snow Emergency Policy be shared with Parishioners. Whenever a county/city within the Diocese of Toledo is placed under a Level 3 Snow Emergency, during which all roadways are closed to non-emergency personnel, the Catholic Churches within that geographic region will cancel any scheduled Masses or Parish Center Activities. Roman Catholics in that region, therefore, are dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass. If Masses are cancelled. Catholics are encouraged to participate in Holy Mass via television, radio, or internet, making a spiritual Communion. When Mass is cancelled, all other Diocesan and Parish events in that geographic region are also cancelled and the Immaculate Conception Parish Center will be closed.
