

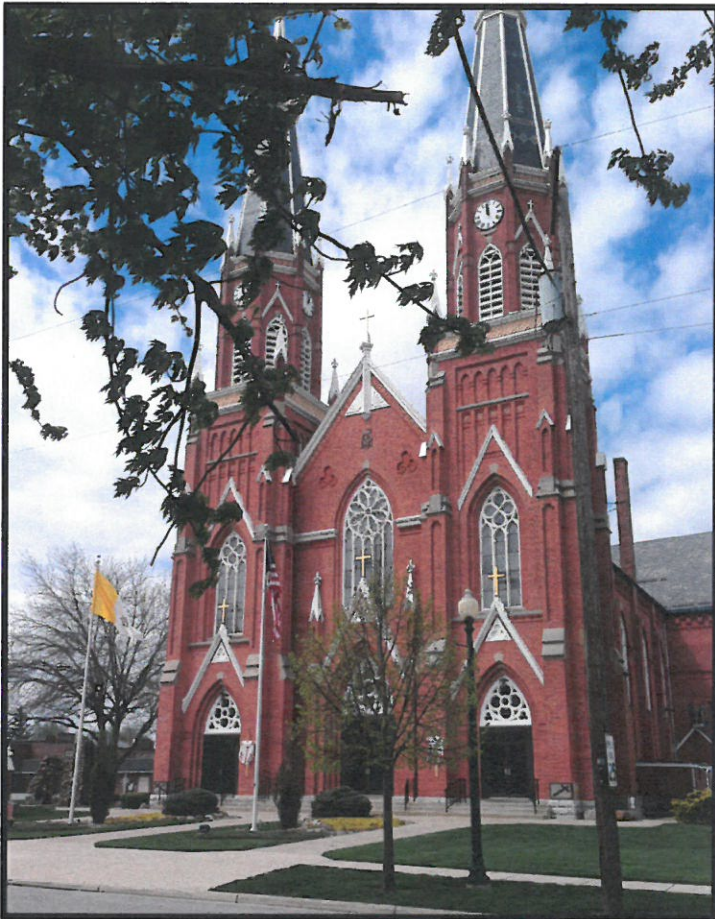

Dear Padre' Question: *I have a hard time being someone who speaks the truth.*

Yes, sometimes life of a prophet is not easy. Speaking the truth can be hard; it's often going against the flow. Even the early prophets found it hard. It is profoundly difficult to be the lone voice of morality. I have struggled as well in novel circumstances to find a way to express my discomfort and speak up to advocate for what I know is right.

The real reality is in knowing the truth and speaking up for what we know is true. It is often easier to lie than speak the truth. One of the greatest moral issues that we all struggle with is that of telling the truth, the whole truth, and nothing but the truth. **So help me God!** Often the main reason for lying is to save face.

Abraham, Sarah, Moses, Aaron, Isaac, Rebekah, Jacob, Rachel, and David all lied, along with Peter in the New Testament. If these saints struggled with being truthful, then none of us is exempt! So we all need to take St. Paul's exhortation to heart (Eph. 4:25): *"Therefore, laying aside falsehood, speak truth each one of you with his neighbor, for we are members of one another."* Truth is an accurate representation of the facts. Truth is conformity to God's standards as revealed in his Word. God is the truth and He always speaks the truth in love. We too must speak the truth in love. Sometimes we speak the truth in a way that is least offensive and most sensitive to the other person's feeling.

At the heart of good communication and close relationships is trust. If you do not trust someone, you instinctively draw back and protect yourself. If you think that he will take personal matters that you share in confidence and broadcast them to others, you will not open up and share your heart. Distrust results in distance in relationships and dishonesty causes distrust. You can spend a lifetime building trust in your marriage or on the job, but one stupid lie can erode that trust in an instant. So, truthfulness is very important to God, because it is the basis for all communication. One can be forgiven. One can change. We all can move on.

Flat Tires

I have leased cars for the past nine years so I haven't had to change a tire during that time. Do you remember when there used to be tubes inside a rubber tire? They quit making car tires with tubes sometime in the 1960's. I can remember my Dad using a small kit when repairing a flat tire. He used a rough lid to rub around the hole in the tube, applied glue, and then placed a patch over the hole. The tire was then ready to be blown up again.

My first recollection of a flat tire was when I was about 5 years old. My father got out of the car and first said some nasty cuss words about the situation. I got out of the car and said the same words that he said. My Mom didn't approve so I got scolded for it. My answer was, "Well, Dad said it!"... but that didn't help me any.

After saving gas stamps near the end of World War II our family took a vacation back to Moore, Indiana, a very small town with a population of less than 15 (located between Waterloo, Butler and Auburn). This was where I was born and my parents lived there until I was almost four years old. We moved back to a farm near McConnelsville, Ohio, where my parents had grown up on farms. On the way home in 1945 we had 4 flat tires!

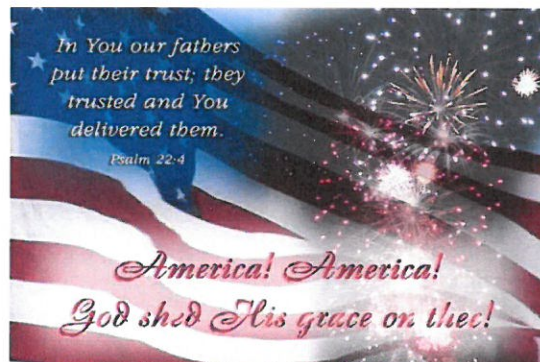

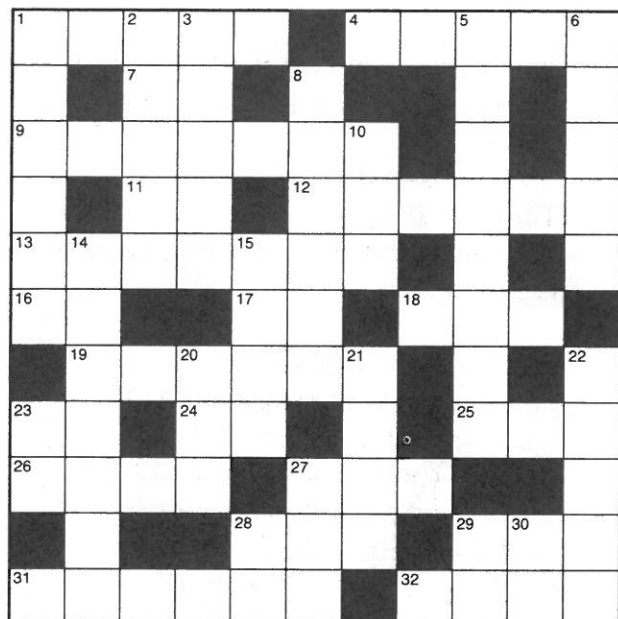
