# **Dear Padre'...** Question: What is the Solemnity of Christ the King really about?

The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, commonly referred to as the Feast of Christ the King, is a relatively recent addition to the Western liturgical calendar, having been instituted in 1925 by Pope Pius XI for the Catholic Church. Europe was still healing from the effects of World War 1. The once great Catholic monarchies of Europe had been replaced by fascists, socialists and communists...all styles of government that are opposed to religious observance. Europe was beginning to turn away from God and his Church. The intent of this solemnity was to let all people know that the kings of men will never match the great and glorious, merciful, and mighty kingship of Jesus Christ. The Church was staking her claim with the powers of heaven. In 1970 the Churches observance was moved to the final Sunday of Ordinary Time. Therefore, the earliest date on which it can occur is November 20th (this year is the earliest) and the latest is November 27th. Many other churches have adopted it along with the Revised Common Lectionary. It is also observed on the same computed date as the final Sunday of the ecclesiastical year, the Sunday before the First Sunday of Advent. We end the year celebrating who He is... King of Heaven and earth. Scripture helps us see that from the beginning, when Christ came into the world to the very end at his crucifixion, he was declared as a king.

"He shall be great, and shall be called the Son of the most High; and the Lord God shall give unto Him the throne of David His father; and He shall reign in the house of Jacob forever. And of His kingdom there shall be no end". (Lk 1:32-33) Later, Pilate therefore said to Him: Are you a king then? Jesus answered: You say that I am a king. For this reason I was born, and for this reason I came into the world; that I should give testimony to the truth. Every one that hears the truth, hears My voice. (John 18:36-37)

"That in the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of those that are in Heaven, on earth and under the earth: And that every tongue should confess that the Lord Jesus Christ is in the glory of God the Father." (Philippians 2:10-11)
