All Saints..."When the saints go marching in, when the saints go marching in, O, how I want to be in that number... when the saints go marching in!"

Tuesday, November 1st, is a <u>Holy Day of</u> <u>Obligation</u>, There will be 3 opportunities available for Mass that day. At 8:10 a.m., Mass is at Immaculate Conception with the school children in grades 1-6. The third graders will be dressed as witnesses of the holy saints. Masses will also be at 5:00 p.m. at

Immaculate Conception and at 7:00 pm at St. Barbara. All Saints' Day is a solemn holy day of the Catholic Church celebrated annually on November 1. The day is dedicated to the saints of the Church...that is, all those who have attained heaven. It should not be confused with All Souls Day which is observed on November 2 and is dedicated to those who have died and not yet reached heaven. Although millions, or even billions, of people may already be saints, All Saints Day observances tend to focus on known saints or those recognized in the canon of the saints by the Catholic Church.

All Souls Day...Often overshadowed by the two days preceding it, Halloween (October 31) and All Saints Day (November 1), All Souls Day is a solemn celebration in the Roman Catholic Church commemorating all of those who have died and are now in Purgatory being cleansed of their venial (lesser) sins and the temporal punishments for the mortal sins that they had confessed, and being made pure before entering into the presence of God in Heaven. On All Souls Day, we not only remember the dead but we apply our efforts, through prayer, almsgiving, and the Mass, to their release from Purgatory. There are two plenary indulgences attached to All Souls Day, one for visiting a Church and attending Mass and another for visiting a cemetery. (The plenary indulgence for visiting a cemetery can also be obtained every day from November 1-8. While the actions are performed by the living, the merits of the indulgences are applicable only to the souls in Purgatory. Since a plenary indulgence applies to the removing of the temporal punishment for sin, which is the reason why souls are in Purgatory in the first place, applying a plenary indulgence to one of the Holy Souls in Purgatory means that the Holy Soul is being prepared to be released from Purgatory and enter Heaven. I pray that those who have lost a love one this past year will take this opportunity to take advantage of this indulgence. Praying for the dead is a Christian obligation. In the modern world, when many have come to doubt the Church's teaching on Purgatory, the need for such prayers has only increased. The Church devotes the month of November to prayer for all the Holy Souls in Purgatory, and participation in the Mass of All Souls Day is a good way to begin the month.

The Mass intention that day (8:10 Mass at IC) is for All the Souls who have left us this past year from Immaculate Conception parish family (21). Then on Sunday November 6<sup>th</sup>



they'll again be remembered with a roll call and the lighting of a candle in their memory. Along with our intention prayers a candle will be lit and place on St. Joseph's table in their memory.

Dear Padre' ... Question: How does one use one's gifts... what's the value? That's a good question on this weekend that 56 of our students will have been confirmed in the Holy Spirit. I'd like to share a story with you that speaks of one aspect of sharing one's gifts. A wise woman who was hiking in the mountains found a precious stone in a stream. The next day she met another hiker who was hungry, and the wise woman opened her bag to share her food. The hungry hiker saw the precious stone and asked the woman if he could have it. She surrendered it without hesitation. The man left, rejoicing in his good fortune. He knew the stone was worth enough to give him comfort and security. But a few days later he came back to return the stone. I've been thinking, he said. I know how valuable the stone is but I wish to give it back in the hope that you can give me something even more precious. Please give me what you have within you that enabled you to give me the stone in the first place.

It is a big mistake to determine the value of a gift by cost alone. The most precious gifts we have to offer another seldom hold monetary value. The gifts the Holy Spirit descends upon those confirmed with, are great treasures that are to be shared. They are not costly but, nonetheless, valuable.

To those who have received the Holy Spirit in the fullness in the Sacrament of Confirmation, we as a parish family are full of happiness and prayers for you, may you always take what you have received and may it be a sign of God's love. No silver or gold, but a gift to be shared. May God continue to bless and guide you, as a saint in the making.

The goal thermometer above shows that we have reached 20% of the \$500,000 goal for the **Window Restoration Project**. And, as many of you have noticed, the completed windows look beautiful and have made a big difference in the brightness and colors in our church. The first phase of the restoration project is almost completed. Work will continue during the winter months in the Window Creations workshop as they build frames for the remaining windows.
