

Next Week's Gospel: Matthew 12:24-43

Gospel Reflection: Jesus is determined that His disciples will understand how the kingdom grows in their midst. He tells the parable of the weeds in the wheat field. The sower (Jesus) allows both the wheat (those who work for God's kingdom) and the weeds (those who work against God's kingdom) to grow together until the harvest (the end of time).
