### Next Week's Gospel: Mark 6:7-13

Gospel Reflection: If you and a partner were sent to several different schools to talk about your faith, what worries might you have? When Jesus sent His apostles out two by two, He warned them that some people would not welcome them. He insisted that they take to the road without food or money, trusting in God and the goodness of their hosts. If people would not provide for them or listen to their message, they were to move on to the next place. Those who accepted the apostles were rewarded. The sick were healed; the possessed were freed of demons; and sinners were reconciled.

Discussion Points for Gospel: Jesus sent his apostles forth as missionaries without backpacks but not without training. They had learned from His word and example what they were to teach. If you had been one of the Twelve, what would your response to being sent out almost empty-handed have been? Give one example of how you have already participated in Jesus' ministry of teaching or healing.
