

## **Mission Statement**

Our Lady of Grace, founded in 1910 as an Italian ethnic parish, is now a territorial parish of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Greensburg to which all people are welcome. The responsibility of each member of Our Lady of Grace is to hear the Word of God and live it by sharing in worship, especially at Eucharist; by nurturing our Catholic faith through formation and prayer; by reaching out to identify and serve the needs of our parish and the community; and by welcoming others into our faith community. Through our actions, we strive to share, and to encourage others to share, in the fullness of God's kingdom.

#### Baptisms

By appointment only. Please call the parish office at least four months in advance of the birth. A class for parents is required to reflect on the meaning of the sacrament, to review the ceremony, and to highlight the importance of the family's commitment to practicing the Catholic Faith.

#### **Sponsorship Forms**

Forms for our members to serve as sponsors for Baptism and Confirmation must be filled out in person at the Parish Office. To serve as a sponsor, you must be at least 16 years old and a practicing Catholic who has received Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Eucharist. If you are married, it must be within the guidelines of the Catholic Church. Please call the Parish Office to make an appointment to fill out the form.

#### Weddings

Please call the Parish Office at least six months in advance. Do not set a date until you have contacted the parish priest. Pre-marriage preparation classes are required and are available in a couple of forms.

# **The Season of Advent** ~ Of the sacred seasons of the Church Year, Advent is the first, observed

during the first four weeks of each new Church year and leading to the celebration of Christmas. Advent is a time of spiritual preparation for the coming of God into our world and our lives. Celebrating Advent focuses on themes of promise and fulfillment, darkness and light, hope and joy in anticipation of God's presence with us. The word "advent" comes from the Latin *adventus* meaning "arrival" or "coming," particularly of something having great importance. Advent is celebrated not only by thanking God for Christ's first coming as a baby, but also for His presence among us today through the Holy Spirit, and in anticipation of His final coming at the end of time.

Please join the St. Gianna Sodality Rosary for Life on Sunday, December 4, in praying the most holy rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary for the intentions of converting hearts to accept and work toward the culture of life, from the very moment of conception at the beginning, to the natural end of life at the close. The rosary is said at 10 a.m., before the 10:30 a.m. Mass.

# The **Advent Wreath** and the **Colors of Advent** are probably the most popular symbols of the



season. The Advent wreath is a circular garland of evergreen branches where four candles (and often a fifth, in the center) are arranged. During Advent one candle on the wreath is lit each week representing the coming of the Lord. The first, second and fourth weeks' candles are **purple**, the primary color of Advent, symbolizing repentance. The **rose** colored candle used during the third week represents joy

and reveals a shift in the season away from repentance and toward celebration. If used, **white** is the color of the center candle, representing the purity of Christ.

The Baptism of your child is truly something to celebrate! A **Baptism preparation class** will be offered on Sunday, December 4, 9:15 a.m., in the Day Chapel. The session is meant to help parents prepare for and celebrate the Baptism of their child in a joyful and meaningful way. If it has been five years since your last child was baptize, you MUST attend a class. To register, please call the parish office at 724-838-9480.
