

Mission Statement

Our Lady of Grace, founded in 1910 as an Italian ethnic parish, is now a territorial parish of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Greensburg to which all people are welcome. The responsibility of each member of Our Lady of Grace is to hear the Word of God and live it by sharing in worship, especially at Eucharist; by nurturing our Catholic faith through formation and prayer; by reaching out to identify and serve the needs of our parish and the community; and by welcoming others into our faith community. Through our actions, we strive to share, and to encourage others to share, in the fullness of God's kingdom.

Baptisms

By appointment only. Please call the parish office at least four months in advance of the birth. A class for parents is required to reflect on the meaning of the sacrament, to review the ceremony, and to highlight the importance of the family's commitment to practicing the Catholic Faith.

Sponsorship Forms

Forms for our members to serve as sponsors for Baptism and Confirmation must be filled out in person at the Parish Office. To serve as a sponsor, you must be at least 16 years old and a practicing Catholic who has received Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Eucharist. If you are married, it must be within the guidelines of the Catholic Church. Please call the Parish Office to make an appointment to fill out the form.

Weddings

Please call the Parish Office at least six months in advance. Do not set a date until you have contacted the parish priest. Pre-marriage preparation classes are required and are available in a couple of forms.

The Feast of the Immaculate Conception of Our Lady is Thursday, December 8. This solemnity of the conception of Mary falls nine months before the celebration of her birth on September 8. The Church teaches that Mary was free from sin from the moment she was conceived. This special grace prepared her to be the Mother of God. Mary did not earn this freedom in any way. It was simply a gift bestowed by God. The medieval scholar Duns Scoutus explained that "no one owes more to Christ than Mary, the Immaculate One." All Catholics are obligated to attend Mass on Thursday.

THE FEAST OF ST. NICHOLAS is celebrated on Tuesday, December 6. Nicholas may be the most popular saint of all time. Thousands of churches are named after him. He seems to be portrayed

by artists more than any other saint, with the exception of Mary. Nicholas was the bishop of the city of Myra in Asia Minor, in what is now the nation of Turkey. Centuries after he died, his bones were brought to the city of



Bari in Italy. People came to his tomb to pray and many were healed of their illnesses. According to a legend, when Nicholas was a baby and his parents brought him to church to be baptized, he jumped eagerly into the water. When he grew up and was named bishop, he became known as the "wonder-maker." He could heal the sick and calm storms. A story is told about a man who was so poor that he could no longer buy food for his family. He was going to sell his daughters into slavery so they would not starve. Bishop Nicholas found out about this. So, at night, he tossed three bags of gold into their house through a window. In many places, families are visited today by someone dressed up like St. Nicholas. His visit is usually scary. He is accompanied by a devil, who snorts and groans and who rattles chains. Bishop Nicholas tells each person in the family about the things they do wrong, and he encourages them to do better in the coming year. When he leaves, there is a feast. Tangerines are eaten as reminders of the gold he gave to help the poor women. Candy canes are reminders of his crosier, the shepherd's staff that bishops carry.
