Pastor's Notes:

A YEAR OF MERCY

Happy New Year Christian people! Today is the beginning of the new Church year. With that comes an invitation to walk with Jesus once more through the mysteries of His birth, life, death and resurrection. Our guide in doing this will be St. Luke and it will be from His Gospel that most of the Sunday Gospel readings will come. This is also to be a special year for us who follow Jesus. Pope Francis has declared this new liturgical year to be a Holy Year of Mercy. A Holy Year is a very special time in the life of the church. During holy years which usually occur only once every 50 years, a special indulgence is offered offering a remission of all the temporal punishment due for our sins when we die. In other words, anything that would have sent us to Purgatory will be erased and we will have smooth sailing into heaven. There are certain conditions for gaining this indulgence. One is to go to confession during the year and make it a good one by putting all of our sins behind us and starting anew. The Holy Father has decreed that all sins can be forgiven (even the most serious, like abortion) as long as we are truly sorry for them. Another part of it is to make a pilgrimage. It used to be that you had to go to Rome and visit the four major churches there. Now it is made easier for us. Our Bishop has declared eight churches in our diocese to be pilgrimage churches. Each church is to have a holy door to enter through, and each is designated as a special place of blessing. And guess what? We are one of the eight. That is truly an honor and we might expect that many people will visit our church during this coming year and seek the mercy of God in prayer here. I don't know all the details but I do know that we need to find some way of making people feel welcome. This will all begin on December 8, the feast of the Immaculate Conception. I wonder if by choosing our church God isn't telling us that it is time for us to come home to Him to seek His mercy.
