Dear Brothers and Sisters,

To meaningfully celebrate any significant event, we prepare a lot. We take into account every aspect of the celebration so that we may not miss out on any of the details. I believe this also applies to our weekly celebration of Our Lord's Sacrifice – the Holy Eucharist. In order that we be well prepared for the Eucharist we need to take enough time to prepare before the Mass.

With having to travel between two parishes on a weekend between Masses, it leaves me with no time to properly prepare. Also, deep down in my heart there is always this anxiety to finish Mass quickly in order to get to the other place in time to start the next Mass. This new Mass schedule will take effect on December 03, 2017.

This will also affect our CCD schedule. Our time for CCD will be between 9.45 am - 11.15 am, starting that same Sunday.

Nov. 01 – All Saints Day: All Saints Day is a special feast day on which Catholics celebrate all the saints, known and unknown. While many saints have a particular feast day on the Catholic calendar. Saints who have not been canonized—those who are in Heaven, but whose sainthood is known only to God—have no particular feast day. In a special way, All Saints Day is their feast.

All Saints Day arose out of the Christian tradition of celebrating the martyrdom of saints on the anniversary of their martyrdom. When martyrdoms increased during the persecutions of the late Roman Empire, local dioceses instituted a common feast day in order to ensure that all martyrs, known and unknown, were properly honored.

The current date of November 1 was instituted by Pope Gregory III (731-741), when he consecrated a chapel to all the martyrs in Saint Peter's Basilica in Rome.

Gregory ordered his priests to celebrate the Feast of All Saints annually. This celebration was originally confined to the diocese of Rome, but Pope Gregory IV (827-844) extended the feast to the entire Church and ordered it to be celebrated on November 1.

All Saints day is the holy day of obligation for us. Our mass schedule for the day is -

10/31 @ 7.00 pm at St. Patrick & St. Louis 11/01 @ 09.15 am St. Louis

12.00 noon at St. Patrick

Nov. 02 - All Souls Day: According to Catholic belief, the soul of a person who dies can go to one of three places. The first is heaven, where a person who dies in a state of perfect grace and communion with God goes. The second is hell, where those who die in a state of mortal sin are naturally condemned by their choice. The intermediate option is purgatory, which is thought to be where most people, free of mortal sin, but still in a state of lesser (venial) sin, must go. Purgatory is necessary so that souls can be cleansed and perfected before they enter into heaven. There is scriptural basis for this belief. The primary reference is in 2 Maccabees, 12:26 and 12:32. Consistent with these teachings and traditions, Catholics believe that through the prayers of the faithful on Earth, the dead are cleansed of their sins so they may enter into heaven. Our Mass for All Souls Day (11/02) is at 08.00 am.

First Friday Adoration: Mark your calendar for Nov. 03 for First Friday Eucharistic Adoration and the Sacrament of Reconciliation between 7 pm and 8 pm.


