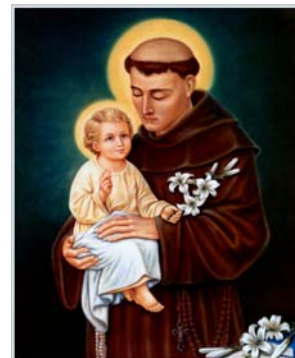

Community Through Communication

Community is at the root of our Christian experience. The Trinity teaches us that just as God is three Persons in one – the very embodiment of relationship – so too are we in infinite relationship with those around us, with God, and with all of creation. Relationships require work and they require communication. This is why we place an invitation to dialogue in the bulletin each week. Only through conversation with one another can we achieve clarity of thought on the complex issues of our time. Only in relationship with one another can we discern God's presence and purpose in our lives. To facilitate the growth of community through communication we are presenting a series of articles by Mary Snyder focused on Nonviolent Communication:

#7 – Charlottesville - What Are the Needs? (Oct 2017)

As I said my September article, we would continue examining feelings and needs of everyone involved in the Charlottesville, Virginia protest. Here is where we will really put nonviolent communication to work. In this instance, we have a group of people protesting the removal of a statue of General Robert E. Lee, a confederate leader in the Civil War. The governor of Virginia believes it is an offense to our national history and would like it removed. But we have a group of people who believe it is a part of history that is dear to them and they are protesting. It is their right to contest this, which is true, but their very act of protesting is causing violence. If we addressed this violence through the lens of nonviolent communication we would try to look at everyone's feelings and try to find the needs that are not being met.

First, I will deal with my feelings and needs. I have a feeling of fear when I hear of any killings over the removal of a statue. I am afraid because I have a need to see all people treated justly -- Jewish people, white people, as well as people of color. I need justice for all people. I also want to see all people have the ability to enjoy life without fear because of their color of skin, ethnicity, how they talk, etc. I need to live in a world that is safe for everyone, not just a few. I am happier when I know everyone is safe. Those are two of my needs: justice and safety.

There are different kinds of people who gathered and are still gathering in Charlottesville. They also have feelings and needs as well. NVC encourages me to ask the question: What are their feelings and needs? I would guess that they are not happy or they wouldn't be protesting. And I do know that they are mad. I understand that feeling mad or angry is actually a camouflage feeling and it doesn't help us know the real need. We must look under the feeling of anger and see what the feelings are that are driving the anger. Probably it is a feeling of sadness or fear. We don't picture people who strongly protest as being afraid but maybe they are. Are they afraid of losing something? What are they afraid of losing? What is the need that is not going to be met if they just stand by and do nothing? Are they sad because of losing something? What is it they are sad to lose? These feelings point to a need. How would we know? By what the news media tells us? What do these feelings tell us about their needs?

Marshall Rosenberg tells us that needs are beautiful. Through our needs we participate in the divine energy that lives within us – God's life within us. It is not the needs that are in conflict, it is the strategies we use to meet those needs that cause the conflict. We need to identify our needs and use strategies that are healthy and meet, if not everyone's needs, at least most needs.

Is it possible in our United States for people of color to live side by side with different ethnic groups, of people with different religious persuasions, with people who pronounce their words different than we do? We are all people, and what we have in common is feelings and needs. Are we able to learn how to listen to these and act accordingly? I think we can. It is a very big country. Does violence or suing really meet the most needs?

NVC challenges us to keep searching for strategies which will enable us to live together and respect each other. But to do that takes hard work – listening for feelings and needs. It may not solve the problem, but it will help us learn to live together, i.e., to understand each other and to appreciate the uniqueness of and mystery of each individual person created by God.
