Community Through Communication

Community is at the root of our Christian experience. The Trinity teaches us that just as God is three Persons in one – the very embodiment of relationship – so too are we in infinite relationship with those around us, with God, and with all of creation. Relationships require work and they require communication. This is why we place an invitation to dialogue in the bulletin each week. Only through conversation with one another can we achieve clarity of thought on the complex issues of our time. Only in relationship with one another can we discern God's presence and purpose in our lives.

To facilitate the growth of community through communication we are presenting a series of articles by Mary Snyder focused on Nonviolent Communication:

#6 – The NVC Process - Observation, Feeling, Need, and Request (Sept 2017)

In Nonviolent Communication (NVC) #6, I would like to explore an issue that is very much in the news these days - racial violence; especially the Charlottesville episode. I am wondering how NVC could help us "wrap our minds" around something as terrible as this?

I recently read a book called "Jewish Wisdom" by Rabbi Joseph Telushkin about the Jewish lifestyle. In this book there is a story about a rabbi who was counseling a married couple. First the husband spoke and went on a tirade about all of the things wrong with his wife. After he was finished, the rabbi said "You are right." Then, the wife spoke and complained continuously about her husband. After she was finished, the rabbi said "You are right." The rabbi's assistant, who was in the room while all of this was going on, said "Rabbi, first you tell the husband he is right and then you tell the wife she is right. How could both of them be right?" The rabbi said "You are right." The point of the story is that whatever side we are on in life, we think we are right.

Let us try to shed some light on the issue of racial violence. In every life situation NVC offers us a 4-part process: observation, feeling, need and request. Let's take a look at Charlottesville from your perspective.

- 1. Observation: what took place, what did you observe? Note: no judgment as whether the action was right or wrong, whether you agree with it or not, smart or stupid...just what did you see?
- 2. Feeling: how did you feel when you observed this happening? Note: try to identify one of the four basic feelings mad, sad, glad or afraid. There are nuances of these feelings but try to stay with feelings, not thoughts.
- 3. Need: What need of yours was not being met as you observed this event? Can you name your need?
- 4. Request: Having identified what need of yours was not being met by the act that you witnessed, try to compose a request that would be doable to meet your need RIGHT NOW. Note: If you consider punching a hole in the wall of your room as the strategy, ask yourself if that action is really going to meet your need or if it will only bring harm to your body or damage to property, etc. What action can you take right now to meet your need? Remember one of the foundations and principles of NVC: we only do things to meet a need. So look at what you could do to get your need met right now. I would suggest an action or strategy that is healthy or productive. Some examples could be: talking to a friend, writing a letter to your member of Congress, or researching the subject on the internet.


