## **Community Through Communication**

Community is at the root of our Christian experience. The Trinity teaches us that just as God is three Persons in one – the very embodiment of relationship – so too are we in infinite relationship with those around us, with God, and with all of creation. Relationships require work and they require communication. This is why we place an invitation to dialogue in the bulletin each week. Only through conversation with one another can we achieve clarity of thought on the complex issues of our time. Only in relationship with one another can we discern God's presence and purpose in our lives.

To facilitate the growth of community through communication we are presenting a series of articles by Mary Snyder focused on Nonviolent Communication:

# #3 - NEED is an Absolute Resource for LIVING (June 2017)

Think of someone who has no needs. It's impossible to do so because everyone has needs. Needs are the Divine Energy within us (what we traditionally call the SOUL).

There is a priest I know who every once in a while says in his homilies "Instead of asking a person 'How are you?' ask 'How is your soul?" He says your soul is eternal. It lives on after our body dies. When our soul is suffering, he calls it "spiritual suffering."

Marshall Rosenberg, the originator of Non-Violent Communication, would ask "What is alive in you?" When a need is not being met, we suffer. But that need is what is alive in us. That is why we have a feeling of contentment when our needs are met.

God's energy keeps us alive. When it is removed we die. One foundational principle of NVC is: **Need is a resource that life requires to sustain itself.** It is built within us. The divine energy is life giving, always within us. It is always there to care for our well-being. It enriches us. It is a hidden power living within us. Muslims have it, criminals have it, children have it even from the moment they are conceived. It is growing within us. It really is the reason why we grow.

If we focus on what gives us divine energy, on what are our deep needs, we will become more like Jesus and Mary.


