Community Through Communication

Community is at the root of our Christian experience. The Trinity teaches us that just as God is three Persons in one – the very embodiment of relationship – so too are we in infinite relationship with those around us, with God, and with all of creation. Relationships require work and they require communication. This is why we place an invitation to dialogue in the bulletin each week. Only through conversation with one another can we achieve clarity of thought on the complex issues of our time. Only in relationship with one another can we discern God's presence and purpose in our lives.

To facilitate the growth of community through communication we are presenting a series of articles by Mary Snyder focused on Nonviolent Communication:

#4 - Meeting Others' Needs Meets Our Needs Too (July 2017)

Think of a time when you were desperately in need and out of the "clear blue sky" someone came along and helped you out of your desperate situation. How did you feel?

Now think of a time when someone else was desperately in need and you, seeing that you could help, filled that need. Maybe you gave them more than what was required. How did you feel?

This is one foundation and principle of Nonviolent Communication: Our greatest joy comes in meeting our needs and/or helping others get their needs met. Both persons' needs are important. Not one over the other. Could it be the reason why people enjoy volunteering? When you touch the need, you touch the divine energy in the other.

I have a friend who struggled with depression to the point that she became suicidal. She actually had to be revived a few times because of taking too much medication. She finally made a pact with her psychiatrist that when she felt that way, she would call him. Then, if necessary, she would check into a mental institution for a few weeks or more until she became stable, her medication would be adjusted, or both. This actually went on for quite a few years. Her friends tried to help but to no avail.

One day she decided she would volunteer at a place called The Branches. They feed the homeless, the alcohol and drug addicted, and anyone else who needs a meal. They also help the homeless in the winter by wrapping scarves around telephone poles near where they live among other things. They provide many services for the most helpless in our society. My friend is now there almost every day.

By serving at The Branches she has become a changed person and it is absolutely amazing, She still takes medication but she is happy because she has touched a "need" and been touched by a "need." By touching her need as well as the need of another, she touched the divine energy. When she touched the divine energy she was healed.

If we want to become like Jesus and Mary, we must look for the need in ourselves and others and respond accordingly.

Our Way of Lif

For the past few weeks, we have been focusing on Stewardship. This focus may evoke many different responses from people. Some will respond very positively, yet others may shy away. Some will even say that they can't "do" Stewardship this year, because they are "doing" other things. Stewardship is not a one-shot deal, band-aid or brief program. It is our discipleship - it is who we are - it is our life.

When Jesus says to us, "Come, follow me," He didn't mean just today or maybe next week if you have time. He meant for life. Discipleship is forever. Stewardship is a way of being that is incorporated into our daily lives; it plays a part in every decision we make.

When we speak of *Stewardship Renewal*, we are speaking of a communal celebration. Together with our parish community, we formally renew our *commitment* to be active followers of Jesus. This renewal is followed by action, by sharing our resources in thanksgiving and by offering our gifts through prayer and ministry. Though being an active follower of Jesus may begin - and is sustained and fed though our parish and sacraments - the intention of discipleship is to be lived in the world. We are, in a sense, missionary disciples sent to invite others to the faith by the way we live.

In many areas throughout our lives, we celebrate some kind of renewal of commitment. On Holy Thursday, every year, our priests gather together to renew their sacred vows in front of the community, yet they live out their priesthood every day. As Catholic Christians, we renew our Baptismal promises

every year at Easter. We live as Catholics every day, but come together as a community to renew our promises on the most sacred of days. We also celebrate birthdays and wedding anniversaries every year, sometimes renewing our vows in milestone years. Does this mean we only think about being married once a year? Or do we reflect on these vows nearly every day? How about a commitment to healthy living? This too requires daily (sometimes hourly!!) recommitment.

As Christian stewards, this sense of reflection and the renewal of our commitment to be disciples of

Jesus should be present in our daily lives. Yes, commitment requires awareness, discipline and sacrifice; many times we are not perfect. But the journey of discipleship and renewal can bring great happiness and joy!



We, in turn, can bring this great joy of faith into the world by our deeds and actions.

When we do just that, we are missionary disciples - going into the world, proclaiming the Gospel with our lives and inviting others to the faith by the way we live. We are not simply "doing" Stewardship; we are living it!




