

Children's Liturgy Of the Word

We are happy to announce that we will be having Children's Liturgy of the Word at the 11am Mass on **November 12th** and **November 26th**.

What is Children's Liturgy of the Word?

Children's Liturgy of the Word is when right after the opening prayer, but before the readings, children are called up by the priest and accompanied by Catechists to the Worship Room in the Parish Center. There, they hear and reflect on the readings at an age appropriate level, sing the Responsorial Psalm, the Gospel Acclamation and recite a simple Creed before returning to the church to join the rest of the community for the Liturgy of the Eucharist. This will take approximately 20 minutes. During this time the adults and anyone else in the church will be hearing the readings as they usually do.

How can my child participate in the Children's Liturgy of the Word?

When you come to the 11:00 am Mass on the Sundays listed above, follow the directions of the priest when he calls the children forward to be sent to the Worship Room in the Parish Center. Any child in Level 1 or above is invited to participate.

Stewardship News ~ Commitment Weekend~



A Way of Life

For the past few weeks, we have been focusing on Stewardship. This focus may evoke many different responses from people. Some will respond very positively, yet others may shy away. Some will even say that they can't "do" Stewardship this year, because they are "doing" other things. Stewardship is not a one-shot deal, band-aid or brief program. It is our discipleship - it is who we are - it is our life.

When Jesus says to us, "Come, follow me," He didn't mean just today or maybe next week if you have time. He meant for life. Discipleship is forever. Stewardship is a way of being that is incorporated into our daily lives; it plays a part in every decision we make.

When we speak of *Stewardship Renewal*, we are speaking of a communal celebration. Together with our parish community, we formally renew our *commitment* to be active followers of Jesus. This renewal is followed by action, by sharing our resources in thanksgiving and by offering our gifts through prayer and ministry. Though being an active follower of Jesus may begin - and is sustained and fed though our parish and sacraments - the intention of discipleship is to be lived in the world. We are, in a sense, missionary disciples sent to invite others to the faith by the way we live.

In many areas throughout our lives, we celebrate some kind of renewal of commitment. On Holy Thursday, every year, our priests gather together to renew their sacred vows in front of the community, yet they live out their priesthood every day. As Catholic Christians, we renew our Baptismal promises

every year at Easter. We live as Catholics every day, but come together as a community to renew our promises on the most sacred of days. We also celebrate birthdays and wedding anniversaries every year, sometimes renewing our vows



in milestone years. Does this mean we only think about being married once a year? Or do we reflect on these vows nearly every day? How about a commitment to healthy living? This too requires daily (sometimes hourly!!) recommitment.

As Christian stewards, this sense of reflection and the renewal of our commitment to be disciples of

Jesus should be present in our daily lives. Yes, commitment requires awareness, discipline and sacrifice; many times we are not perfect. But the journey of discipleship and renewal can bring great happiness and joy!



We, in turn, can bring this great joy of faith into the world by our deeds and actions.

When we do just that, we are missionary disciples - going into the world, proclaiming the Gospel with our lives and inviting others to the faith by the way we live. We are not simply "doing" Stewardship; we are living it!

Parish Social Ministry



The goal of Parish Social Ministry is to engage parishioners in social justice and outreach activities that allow us to live out the Gospel call to serve others and to build the Kingdom of God. Clare House is a community space where we exchange resources, offer assistance, and build relationships.

The Outreach Ministry at Clare House offers direct service to community members facing difficulties of all kinds. We strive to build authentic relationships with every individual who walks through the door and commit to journey in solidarity with them. We offer assistance to alleviate immediate needs. Clients receive access to: food pantry, thrift shop, case management, advocacy, information and referral, and other resources.

The Social Justice Ministry at Clare House works to expand our understanding and application of Catholic Social Justice through the use of praxis. We employ the "See, Judge, Act" Method to examine pressing social problems. By utilizing education, advocacy, and community organizing we put our faith in action to address structural issues and eliminate systemic injustice. We feed the hungry and ask why they are hungry. The Social Justice Committee meets first Thursdays at 7pm in Clare House. ALL ARE WELCOME!

Charity AND Justice

Catholic institutions have played a critical role over the past 100+ years in providing direct services and material relief to families and individuals in need of immediate, short-term assistance. These services (food, shelter, clothing, financial assistance, etc.) help people make it through another day, and are an expression of Charity and corporal works of mercy.


Charitable works represent one of the "Two Feet of Love in Action"*. The second, equally essential, expression of 'love for neighbor' involves working to change the systems and structures (our laws and public policies) that hurt people – stripping them of their dignity and creating social or economic harm to them. This 'second foot' of Catholic Social Teaching is called Social Justice. Effective work in this area can actually help to reduce the number of people in need of immediate help.

Catholic parishes often feel more equipped to provide direct services, but the Catholic Church also has a long history of supporting the rights and well-being of poor people, workers, immigrants, and people in prison or returning to the community after prison.

Pope Francis has been a powerful champion of groups of people that are being ignored or excluded in our world, calling on all of us to pay attention to the structures or systems that are creating the injustices they experience – and calling us all to take responsibility for our own role in either accepting or changing those structures.

Pope Francis is reminding us that we need to use both feet to walk in the footsteps of Jesus.
