The goal of Parish Social Ministry is to engage parishioners in social justice and outreach activities that allow us to live out the Gospel call to serve others and to build the Kingdom of God. Clare House is a community space where we exchange resources, offer assistance, and build relationships.

The Outreach Ministry at Clare House offers direct service to community members facing difficulties of all kinds. We strive to build authentic relationships with every individual who walks through the door and commit to journey in solidarity with them. We offer assistance to alleviate immediate needs. Clients receive access to: food pantry, thrift shop, case management, advocacy, information and referral, and other resources.

The Social Justice Ministry at Clare House works to expand our understanding and application of Catholic Social Justice through the use of praxis. We employ the "See, Judge, Act" Method to examine pressing social problems. By utilizing education, advocacy, and community organizing we put our faith in action to address structural issues and eliminate systemic injustice. We feed the hungry and ask why they are hungry. The Social Justice Committee meets first Thursdays at 7pm in Clare House. ALL ARE WELCOME!

# What is Scrip?

Over the years, you may have heard that St. Sylvester has a thriving Scrip program, but how many of you (be honest now!) don't really know what Scrip is?

Simply stated, Scrip is a fundraising program in which our Church has the ability to purchase gift cards from participating retailers at a discount. In most cases, the discount is 5%; for example, a \$100 Stop & Shop gift card would cost the Church \$95. The parishioner then purchases the card for \$100, and uses it for themselves, or as a gift for family or friends. The \$5 difference between the sale price of \$100, and the purchase price of \$95 is kept by the Church to help defray our costs.

We have cards in various dominations, from \$10 to \$100, for Meat Farms, ShopRite, Stop & Shop, King Kullen, Target, Kohl's, Applebees, Cheesecake Factory, Dunkin Donuts, Starbucks, Outback/Carrabas and Panera Bread all year round, which you can purchase after the weekend Masses or at the Parish Center during normal business hours.

With the holidays rapidly approaching, our Holiday Gift Card Program is back! On the next page, you will find a form where you can order from other popular restaurants and retailers which we don't have on hand. There will also be space on the form for you to inquire about the availability of your own personal favorite gift cards!
