


Welcome to the 2018-2019 Faith Formation Year

We employ the "See, Judge, Act" Method to examine pressing social problems.

Clients receive access to: food pantry, thrift shop, case management, advocacy, information and referral, and other resources.

On September 3rd, our nation celebrated its 123rd Labor Day and its first Labor Day after the U.S. Supreme Court's unjust and politically-motivated ruling in Janus v. AFSCME. From our beginnings in Chicago in the 1960s, Gamaliel has lifted up the importance of the American labor movement and the significant contributions that working people continue to make to the strength and prosperity of our communities and our nation. In fact, the vast majority of our affiliates in the 16 states in which we work include local labor unions and councils as contributing members to our work of creating structural racial equity, building people's control of government and the economy, and expanding the public sphere.



So am I angry about the efforts of corporate and other private and political interests to move an agenda to consolidate power by changing the structures and institutions of decision-making, ultimately making it harder for regular people to have an impact on the decisions that impact their lives? YOU BET I AM!

But am I also hopeful? YOU BET I AM!

Parish Social Ministry



Last month our affiliates in Missouri—Metropolitan Congregations United (MCU) in metro St. Louis and Metro Organization for Racial and Economic Equity in metro Kansas City (MORE2)—working with labor and community members succeeded in fighting back against those corporate and anti-worker forces who placed Proposition A, a "right to work" initiative, on the August ballot. At the end of the day, Missourians, who considered a similar ballot initiative in 1978, said the same thing, "NO! We support the right of working people to organize and to have a say in the issues that impact the quality of their lives," by a margin of 67 to 33.



Our leaders and organizers in St. Louis tell us that the win resulted from the convergence of several key efforts: the collaborative work of faith, community and labor; relationship-building in communities across the state through deep canvassing efforts; connection of the issue to two other critical ballot initiatives that have significant impact on the rights of working people and Missouri communities; and a shift in the narrative about what is possible in the state.

What happened in Missouri is being replicated in other places across the Gamaliel Network. Our local organizations are building strong faith, labor, and community collaboratives with an eye toward transforming the dominant narrative that places profits ahead of people and corporations ahead of community into a transformational narrative that celebrates the dignity and worth of all working people and their communities.

So, yes, I am hopeful . . . but more than that I am confident in the future that we are building together that lifts up all people, especially working people.

Ana Garcia-Ashley is the second Executive Director of Gamaliel and the first woman of color and immigrant to lead a national faith-based community organizing network.

The Gamaliel Network is a community organizing network with affiliates in 16 states and 44 regions whose organizing work draws on struggles for justice by people of faith spanning many nations, creeds, and cultures. Gamaliel's work draws on the sacred writings of its multiple faith traditions—Christian teachings from the Bible, the Torah, Catholic social teaching—as well as the founding principles of American democracy, the U.S. civil rights movement, and many other sources. Above all, Gamaliel's work begins and ends in an expression of the personal faith and values of its members.
